AN ACT

To repeal sections 34.165 and 178.930, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to state purchasing and printing.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 34.165 and 178.930, RSMo, are repealed and two new
2 sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 34.165 and 178.930, to
3 read as follows:

34.165. 1. In making purchases for this state, its governmental agencies
2 or political subdivisions, the commissioner of administration shall give a bidding
3 preference consisting of a [five-point] **ten-point** bonus on bids for products and
4 services manufactured, produced or assembled in qualified nonprofit
5 organizations for the blind established pursuant to the provisions of 41 U.S.C.
6 sections 46 to 48c, as amended and in sheltered workshops holding a certificate
7 of approval from the department of elementary and secondary education pursuant
8 to section 178.920, RSMo, **if the work generates in excess of five thousand**
9 **dollars in annual revenue for the participating nonprofit organization.**

10 2. **An affidavit signed by the director or manager and the board**
11 **president of a participating nonprofit organization shall be provided**
12 **to the purchasing agency by the contractor at the completion of the**
13 **contract or within thirty days of the first anniversary of the contract,**
14 **whichever first occurs, verifying compliance.**

15 3. The commissioner of administration shall make such rules and
16 regulations regarding specifications, quality standards, time of delivery,

17 performance and other relevant matters as shall be necessary to carry out the
18 purpose of this section. No rule or portion of a rule promulgated pursuant to the
19 authority of this section shall become effective unless it has been promulgated
20 pursuant to the provisions of section 536.024, RSMo.

21 [3.] 4. At the request of the commissioner of administration, the state
22 auditor may examine all records, books and data of any qualified nonprofit
23 organization for the blind to determine the costs of manufacturing products or
24 rendering services and the manner and efficiency of production and
25 administration of such nonprofit organization with relation to any product or
26 services purchased by this state, its governmental agencies or political
27 subdivisions and to furnish the results of such examination to the commissioner
28 for appropriate action.

178.930. 1. (1) Beginning July 1, [1999] **2006**, and [thereafter] **until**
2 **June 30, 2007**, the department of elementary and secondary education shall pay
3 monthly, out of the funds appropriated to it for that purpose, to each sheltered
4 workshop a sum equal to [thirteen dollars multiplied by the number of six-hour
5 or longer days worked by handicapped workers] **sixty-five dollars for each**
6 **standard workweek (Monday through Friday) of up to and including**
7 **thirty hours worked** during the preceding calendar month. **Thirteen dollars**
8 **shall be paid for each six-hour or longer day worked by a handicapped**
9 **employee on Saturdays or Sundays.** For each handicapped worker employed
10 by a sheltered workshop for less than **a thirty-hour week or** a six-hour day **on**
11 **Saturdays or Sundays**, the workshop shall receive a percentage of the [thirteen
12 dollars] **corresponding amount normally paid** based on the percentage of
13 [the six-hour day] time worked by the handicapped employee.

14 (2) Beginning July 1, **2007**, and until **June 30, 2008**, the
15 **department of elementary and secondary education shall pay monthly,**
16 **out of the funds appropriated to it for that purpose, to each sheltered**
17 **workshop a sum equal to seventy-five dollars for each standard**
18 **workweek (Monday through Friday) of up to and including thirty hours**
19 **worked during the preceding calendar month. Fifteen dollars shall be**
20 **paid for each six-hour or longer day worked by a handicapped**
21 **employee on Saturdays or Sundays.** For each handicapped worker
22 **employed by a sheltered workshop for less than a thirty-hour week or**
23 **six-hour day on Saturdays or Sundays, the workshop shall receive a**
24 **percentage of the corresponding amount normally paid based on the**

25 percentage of time worked by the handicapped employee.

26 (3) Beginning July 1, 2008, and until June 30, 2009, the
27 department of elementary and secondary education shall pay monthly,
28 out of the funds appropriated to it for that purpose, to each sheltered
29 workshop a sum equal to eighty-five dollars for each standard
30 workweek (Monday through Friday) of up to and including thirty hours
31 worked during the preceding calendar month. Seventeen dollars shall
32 be paid for each six-hour or longer day worked by a handicapped
33 employee on Saturdays or Sundays. For each handicapped worker
34 employed by a sheltered workshop for less than a thirty-hour week or
35 six-hour day on Saturdays or Sundays, the workshop shall receive a
36 percentage of the corresponding amount normally paid based on the
37 percentage of time worked by the handicapped employee.

38 (4) Beginning July 1, 2009, and thereafter, the department of
39 elementary and secondary education shall pay monthly, out of the
40 funds appropriated to it for that purpose, to each sheltered workshop
41 a sum equal to ninety dollars for each standard workweek (Monday
42 through Friday) of up to and including thirty hours worked during the
43 preceding calendar month. Eighteen dollars shall be paid for each six-
44 hour or longer day worked by a handicapped employee on Saturdays
45 or Sundays. For each handicapped worker employed by a sheltered
46 workshop for less than a thirty-hour week or six-hour day on Saturdays
47 or Sundays, the workshop shall receive a percentage of the
48 corresponding amount normally paid based on the percentage of time
49 worked by the handicapped employee.

50 2. The department shall accept, as prima facie proof of payment due to a
51 sheltered workshop, information as designated by the department, either in paper
52 or electronic format. A statement signed by the president, secretary, and
53 manager of the sheltered workshop, setting forth the dates worked and the
54 number of hours worked each day by each handicapped person employed by that
55 sheltered workshop during the preceding calendar month, together with any other
56 information required by the rules or regulations of the department, shall be
57 maintained at the workshop location.

58 3. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Sheltered Workshop
59 Per Diem Revolving Fund" which shall be administered by the commissioner of
60 the department of elementary and secondary education. All moneys appropriated
61 pursuant to subsection 1 of this section shall be deposited in the fund and

62 expended as described in subsection 1 of this section.

63 4. The balance of the sheltered workshop per diem revolving fund shall
64 not exceed five hundred thousand dollars at the end of each fiscal year and shall
65 be exempt from the provisions of section 33.080, RSMo, relating to the transfer
66 of unexpended balances to the general revenue fund. Any unexpended balance
67 in the sheltered workshop per diem revolving fund at the end of each fiscal year
68 exceeding five hundred thousand dollars shall be deposited in the general revenue
69 fund.
