AN ACT

To repeal sections 196.970, 196.973, 196.976, 196.981, 196.984, and 556.001, RSMo, section 196.979 as enacted by senate bill no. 491, ninety-seventh general assembly, second regular session, and section 196.979 as enacted by house bill no. 1687, ninety-third general assembly, second regular session, and to enact in lieu thereof nine new sections relating to the prescription drug repository, with existing penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 196.970, 196.973, 196.976, 196.981, 196.984, and
2 556.001, RSMo, section 196.979 as enacted by senate bill no. 491, ninety-seventh
3 general assembly, second regular session, and section 196.979 as enacted by
4 house bill no. 1687, ninety-third general assembly, second regular session, are
5 repealed and nine new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections
6 338.700, 338.705, 338.710, 338.715, 338.720, 338.725, 338.730, 338.735, and
7 556.001 to read as follows:

[196.970.] **338.700.** Sections [196.970 to 196.984] **338.700 to 338.735**
2 shall be known and may be cited as the "Prescription Drug Repository Program
3 Act".

[196.973.] **338.705.** As used in sections [196.970 to 196.984] **338.700 to**
2 **338.735**, the following terms shall mean:

3 (1) "Health care professional", any of the following persons licensed and
4 authorized to prescribe and dispense drugs and to provide medical, dental, or

5 other health-related diagnoses, care, or treatment:

6 (a) A licensed physician or surgeon;

7 (b) A registered nurse or licensed practical nurse;

8 (c) A physician assistant;

9 (d) A dentist;

10 (e) A dental hygienist;

11 (f) An optometrist;

12 (g) A pharmacist; and

13 (h) A podiatrist;

14 (2) "Hospital", the same meaning as such term is defined in section
15 197.020;

16 (3) ["Nonprofit clinic", a facility organized as not for profit in which
17 advice, counseling, diagnosis, treatment, surgery, care, or services relating to the
18 preservation or maintenance of health are provided on an outpatient basis for a
19 period of less than twenty-four consecutive hours to persons not residing or
20 confined at such facility;

21 (4)] **"Donor", a person that donates to the program prescription
22 drugs, devices, or supplies needed to administer such drugs;**

23 (4) "Out-of-state charitable repository", any of the following:

24 (a) A bona fide charitable, religious, or nonprofit organization, licensed or
25 registered in this state as an out-of-state wholesale drug distributor under
26 sections 338.210 to 338.370 and that otherwise qualifies as an exempt
27 organization under Section 501(c)(3) of Title 26, United States Code, as amended;
28 or

29 (b) A foreign medical aid mission group that distributes pharmaceuticals
30 and health care supplies to needy persons abroad;

31 (5) **"Participant", a health care professional or pharmacy that has
32 elected to participate in the program and accepts prescription drugs,
33 devices, and supplies from donors for the program;**

34 (6) "Prescription drug", a drug which may be dispensed only upon
35 prescription by an authorized prescriber and which is approved for safety and
36 effectiveness as a prescription drug under Section 505 or 507 of the Federal Food,
37 Drug, and Cosmetic Act;

38 (7) **"Program", the prescription drug repository program
39 established under sections 338.700 to 338.735;**

40 (8) **"Supplies", any supplies used in the administration of a**

41 **prescription drug.**

[196.976.] **338.710.** 1. [By January 1, 2005, the department of health
2 and senior services shall establish] **The state board of pharmacy shall**
3 **establish** the "Prescription Drug Repository Program" [to] **and contract with**
4 **a third party to administer the program which shall** accept and dispense
5 prescription drugs, **devices, and supplies** donated for the purpose of being
6 dispensed to persons who are residents of Missouri and who meet eligibility
7 requirements established by rules promulgated pursuant to section [196.984]
8 **338.735.**

9 2. The following criteria shall be used in accepting drugs for use in the
10 program:

11 (1) Only prescription drugs in their original sealed and tamper-evident
12 unit dose packaging shall be accepted and dispensed pursuant to the program;

13 (2) The packaging must be unopened; except that prescription drugs
14 packaged in single-unit doses may be accepted and dispensed when the outside
15 packaging is opened if the single-unit-dose packaging is undisturbed **and even**
16 **if one or more of the drugs have been dispensed so long as the**
17 **remaining drugs are kept sealed in the single-dose packaging and have**
18 **not been disturbed or tampered;**

19 (3) Prescription drugs donated by individuals shall bear the
20 manufacturer's lot number and an expiration date that is less than six months
21 from the date the prescription drug is donated shall not be accepted or dispensed;
22 and

23 (4) A prescription drug shall not be accepted or dispensed if there is
24 reason to believe that the drug is adulterated as described in section 196.095;

25 (5) Subject to the limitations specified in this section, unused prescription
26 drugs dispensed for purposes of a medical assistance program may be accepted
27 and dispensed under the prescription drug repository program.

28 **3. Prescription drugs that can only be dispensed to a patient**
29 **registered with the drug's manufacturer in accordance with federal**
30 **Food and Drug Administration requirements shall not be accepted or**
31 **distributed through the program.**

338.715. 1. **The board shall develop and maintain a participant**
2 **registry for the program. A participant registry created under this**
3 **subsection shall include the name, address, and telephone number of**
4 **the participants. The participant registry shall be available on the**

5 **board's website.**

6 **2. The board may cooperate with nongovernmental organizations**
7 **to maintain a web-based list of prescription drugs, devices, and**
8 **supplies that have been donated and are available through the program**
9 **and the participants from which the donated items may be available.**

 [196.979.] **338.720. 1. [Any person] A donor**, including but not limited
2 to a prescription drug manufacturer or health care facility, may donate
3 prescription drugs, **devices, or supplies** to the [prescription drug repository]
4 program **through a health care professional or pharmacy that meets the**
5 **criteria for such participation.** The drugs [shall be donated at a pharmacy,
6 hospital, or nonprofit clinic that elects to participate in the prescription drug
7 repository program and meets the criteria for participation established by rule of
8 the department pursuant to section 196.984. Participation in the program by
9 pharmacies, hospitals, and nonprofit clinics shall be voluntary. Nothing in
10 sections 196.970 to 196.984 shall require any pharmacy, hospital, or nonprofit
11 clinic to participate in the program], **devices, or supplies shall not be**
12 **donated directly to a specific patient.**

13 **2. Only** a [pharmacy, hospital, or nonprofit clinic which meets the
14 eligibility requirements established in section 196.984] **participant** may
15 dispense [prescription drugs] donated **items** under the program to persons who
16 are residents of Missouri and who meet the eligibility requirements of the
17 program, or to other governmental entities and nonprofit private entities to be
18 dispensed to persons who meet the eligibility requirements of the program. [A
19 prescription drug] **Donated items** shall be dispensed only pursuant to a
20 prescription issued by a health care professional who is authorized by statute to
21 prescribe drugs. A [pharmacy, hospital, or nonprofit clinic] **participant** which
22 accepts donated [prescription] drugs, **devices, or supplies under the**
23 **program** shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws dealing with the
24 storage and distribution of [dangerous] **prescription drugs, devices, or**
25 **supplies** and shall inspect all [prescription drugs] **donated items** prior to
26 dispensing [the prescription drugs] to determine that they are not adulterated as
27 described in section 196.095. [The pharmacy, hospital, or nonprofit clinic] **A**
28 **participant** may charge persons receiving donated prescription drugs a handling
29 fee, not to exceed a maximum of two hundred **fifty** percent of the Medicaid
30 dispensing fee[, established by rule of the department promulgated pursuant to
31 section 196.984]. Prescription drugs, **devices, or supplies** donated to the

32 program shall not be resold. Any individual who knowingly resells any donated
33 prescription drugs pursuant to sections [196.970 to 196.984] **338.700 to 338.735**
34 shall be guilty of a class E felony.

35 3. Drugs donated under this section that are not used or accepted by [any
36 pharmacy, hospital, or nonprofit clinic] **a participant** in this state may be
37 distributed to out-of-state charitable repositories for use outside of this
38 state. Such donated drugs may be repackaged in a manner appropriate for
39 distribution by participating pharmacies, hospitals, and nonprofit clinics.

40 4. **A dispenser of donated prescription drugs, devices, or supplies**
41 **may not submit a claim or otherwise seek reimbursement from any**
42 **public or private third-party payer for the cost of donated prescription**
43 **drugs, devices, or supplies dispensed to any eligible individual under**
44 **the program. A public or private third-party payer is not required to**
45 **provide reimbursement to a dispenser for the cost of donated**
46 **prescription drugs, devices, or supplies dispensed to any eligible**
47 **individual under the program.**

[196.979.] **338.720.** 1. [Any person] **A donor**, including but not limited
2 to a prescription drug manufacturer or health care facility, may donate
3 prescription drugs, **devices, or supplies** to the [prescription drug repository]
4 program **through a health care professional or pharmacy that meets the**
5 **criteria for such participation.** The drugs [shall be donated at a pharmacy,
6 hospital, or nonprofit clinic that elects to participate in the prescription drug
7 repository program and meets the criteria for participation established by rule of
8 the department pursuant to section 196.984. Participation in the program by
9 pharmacies, hospitals, and nonprofit clinics shall be voluntary. Nothing in
10 sections 196.970 to 196.984 shall require any pharmacy, hospital, or nonprofit
11 clinic to participate in the program], **devices, or supplies shall not be**
12 **donated directly to a specific patient.**

13 2. **Only** a [pharmacy, hospital, or nonprofit clinic which meets the
14 eligibility requirements established in section 196.984] **participant** may
15 dispense [prescription drugs] donated **items** under the program to persons who
16 are residents of Missouri and who meet the eligibility requirements of the
17 program, or to other governmental entities and nonprofit private entities to be

38 state. Such donated drugs may be repackaged in a manner appropriate for
39 distribution by participating pharmacies, hospitals, and nonprofit clinics.

40 4. **A dispenser of donated prescription drugs, devices, or supplies**
41 **may not submit a claim or otherwise seek reimbursement from any**
42 **public or private third-party payer for the cost of donated prescription**
43 **drugs, devices, or supplies dispensed to any eligible individual under**
44 **the program. A public or private third-party payer is not required to**
45 **provide reimbursement to a dispenser for the cost of donated**
46 **prescription drugs, devices, or supplies dispensed to any eligible**
47 **individual under the program.**

[196.981.] **338.725.** 1. The following persons and entities when acting
2 in good faith shall not be subject to criminal or civil liability for injury, death, or
3 loss to person or property, or professional disciplinary action for matters related
4 to donating, accepting, or dispensing prescription drugs under the prescription
5 drug repository program:

6 (1) The [department of health and senior services] **state board of**
7 **pharmacy;**

8 (2) [The director of the department of health and senior services;

9 (3)] Any prescription drug manufacturer, governmental entity, or person

10 donating prescription drugs, **devices, or supplies** to the program;

11 [(4)] **(3)** Any pharmacy, hospital, nonprofit clinic, out-of-state charitable
12 repository, or health care professional that prescribes, accepts or dispenses
13 prescription drugs, **devices, or supplies** under the program; and

14 [(5)] **(4)** Any pharmacy, hospital, nonprofit clinic, or out-of-state
15 charitable repository that employs or has a hospital medical staff affiliation with
16 a health care professional who accepts or dispenses prescription drugs, **devices,**
17 **or supplies** under the program.

18 2. A prescription drug manufacturer shall not, in the absence of bad faith,
19 be subject to criminal or civil liability for injury, death, or loss to person or
20 property for matters related to the donation, acceptance, or dispensing of a
21 prescription drug manufactured by the prescription drug manufacturer that is
22 donated by any person under the program, including but not limited to liability
23 for failure to transfer or communicate product or consumer information or the
24 expiration date of the donated prescription drug.

338.730. 1. A participant shall retain separate records detailing
2 **the receipt, distribution, and dispensing of prescription drugs, devices,**
3 **and supplies under this program.**

4 **2. The records of receipt shall include the:**

- 5 **(1) Name and address of the donor;**
6 **(2) Drug name and strength;**
7 **(3) Manufacturer of the prescription drugs, devices, or supplies;**
8 **(4) Manufacturer lot number;**
9 **(5) Drug expiration date;**
10 **(6) Date received; and**
11 **(7) Quantity received.**

12 **3. Records of distribution and dispensing shall include the:**

- 13 **(1) Name and address of the participant;**
14 **(2) Drug or device name;**
15 **(3) Drug strength;**
16 **(4) Quantity distributed;**
17 **(5) Identity of the manufacturer of the prescription drugs,**
18 **devices, or supplies;**
19 **(6) Manufacturer lot number;**
20 **(7) Expiration date;**
21 **(8) Date of distribution or dispensing; and**

22 **(9) Name and address of the individual to whom the donated**
23 **item was distributed.**

24 **4. Records of dispensing shall include the:**

25 **(1) Requirements for a prescription label; and**

26 **(2) Manufacturer's lot number.**

 [196.984.] **338.735.** 1. [In consultation with] The board of pharmacy[,
2 the director of the department of health and senior services] shall adopt and
3 promulgate rules to implement the prescription drug repository program. Such
4 rules shall include:

5 (1) Eligibility criteria for [pharmacies, hospitals, and nonprofit clinics]
6 **participants** to receive and dispense donated prescription drugs, **devices, and**
7 **supplies** under the program;

8 (2) Standards and procedures for accepting, safely storing, and dispensing
9 donated prescription drugs, **devices, and supplies;**

10 (3) Standards and procedures for inspecting donated prescription drugs
11 to determine that the original single-unit-dose packaging is sealed and
12 tamper-evident and that the prescription drugs are unadulterated, safe, and
13 suitable for dispensing **even if one or more of the drugs have been**
14 **dispensed so long as the remaining drugs are kept sealed in the single-**
15 **dose packaging and have not been disturbed or tampered;**

16 (4) Eligibility requirements for recipients in the program shall be based
17 on economic need for persons to receive prescription drugs under the
18 program. [For purposes of this subdivision, "economic need" means a net family
19 income below three hundred percent of the federal poverty level;

20 (5) An identification card by which a person who is eligible to receive
21 donated prescription drugs under the program may demonstrate eligibility to the
22 pharmacy, hospital, or nonprofit clinic;

23 (6)] **(5)** A form that a person receiving a prescription drug from the
24 program must sign before receiving the drug to confirm that such person
25 understands the criminal and civil immunity from liability provisions of the
26 program;

27 [(7) Establishing a maximum handling fee that pharmacies, hospitals, and
28 nonprofit clinics may charge to drug recipients to cover restocking and dispensing
29 costs;

30 (8) For prescription drugs donated to the program by individuals:

31 (a) A list of prescription drugs, arranged by category or by individual

32 drug, that the program will and will not accept from individuals. If a drug is
33 ineligible for donation, the list must include a statement as to the reason the
34 drug is ineligible for donation; and

35 (b) A form each donor must sign stating that the donor is the owner of the
36 prescription drugs and intends to voluntarily donate such drugs to the program;

37 (9) For prescription drugs donated to the program by health care facilities,
38 a list of prescription drugs, arranged by category or by individual drug, that the
39 program will and will not accept from health care facilities. If a drug is ineligible
40 for donation, the list must include a statement as to the reason the drug is
41 ineligible for donation; and

42 (10)] **(6) Standards for educating and providing notice to**
43 **prospective donors, recipients, and participants about the prescription**
44 **drug repository program; and**

45 **(7) Any other standards and procedures the department deems**
46 **appropriate or necessary to implement the provisions of sections [196.970 to**
47 **196.984] 338.700 to 338.735.**

48 2. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010,
49 that is created under the authority delegated in sections [196.970 to 196.984]
50 **338.700 to 338.735** shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject
51 to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. Sections
52 196.970 to 196.984 and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers
53 vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the
54 effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held
55 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed
56 or adopted after August 28, [2004] **2015**, shall be invalid and void.
