by striking "would be" and inserting in lieu thereof the 2 following: "is"; and further amend said bill and page, line 3 5, by inserting an opening bracket "[" immediately before 4 "if"; and further amend line 19, by striking "or"; and 5 Further amend said bill and section, page 2, line 22, 6 by striking the opening bracket "["; and 7 Further amend said bill and section, page 3, line 70, 8 9 by inserting after all of said line the following: "115.279. 1. Application for an absentee ballot may 10 be made by the applicant in person, or by mail, or for the 11 applicant, in person, by his or her guardian or a relative 12 within the second degree by consanguinity or affinity. The 13 election authority shall accept applications by facsimile 14 15 transmission and by electronic mail within the limits of its telecommunications capacity. 16 2. Each application shall be made to the election 17 authority of the jurisdiction in which the person is or 18 would be registered. Each application shall be in writing 19 and shall state the applicant's name, address at which he or 20 21 she is or would be registered, [his or her reason for voting 22 an absentee ballot] whether the applicant is incapacitated 23 or confined due to illness or physical disability or is a person who is primarily responsible for the physical care of 24 a person who is incapacitated or confined due to illness or 25 26 physical disability, the address to which the ballot is to

- 27 be mailed, if mailing is requested, and for absent uniformed 28 services and overseas applicants, the applicant's email 29 address if electronic transmission is requested. [reason for the applicant voting absentee is due to the 30 reasons established under subdivision (6) of subsection 1 of 31 32 section 115.277] applicant is a certified participant in the address confidentiality program established under sections 33 34 589.660 to 589.681, the applicant shall state the voter's identification information provided by the address 35 36 confidentiality program in lieu of the applicant's name, address at which he or she is or would be registered, and 37 address to which the ballot is to be mailed, if mailing is 38 39 requested. Each application to vote in a primary election shall also state which ballot the applicant wishes to 40 receive. If any application fails to designate a ballot, 41 42 the election authority shall, within three working days after receiving the application, notify the applicant by 43 mail that it will be unable to deliver an absentee ballot 44 45 until the applicant designates which political party ballot he or she wishes to receive. If the applicant does not 46 respond to the request for political party designation, the 47 election authority is authorized to provide the voter with 48 that part of the ballot for which no political party 49 50 designation is required. 51
- [Except as provided in subsection 3 of section 115.281, All applications for absentee ballots received 52 53 prior to the sixth Tuesday before an election shall be stored at the office of the election authority until such 54 55 time as the applications are processed in accordance with section 115.281. No application for an absentee ballot 56 received in the office of the election authority by mail, by 57 facsimile transmission, by electronic mail, or by a guardian 58 59 or relative after 5:00 p.m. on the second Wednesday

- immediately prior to the election shall be accepted by any election authority. No application for an absentee ballot submitted by the applicant in person after 5:00 p.m. on the day before the election shall be accepted by any election authority, except as provided in subsections 6, 8 and 9 of this section.
- Each application for an absentee ballot shall be 66 signed by the applicant or, if the application is made by a 67 guardian or relative pursuant to this section, the 68 69 application shall be signed by the guardian or relative, who shall note on the application his or her relationship to the 70 applicant. If an applicant, quardian or relative is blind, 71 72 unable to read or write the English language or physically incapable of signing the application, he or she shall sign 73 74 by mark, witnessed by the signature of an election official 75 or person of his or her own choosing. Any person who 76 knowingly makes, delivers or mails a fraudulent absentee ballot application shall be guilty of a class one election 77 offense. 78
- 79 5. (1) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, any 80 resident of the state of Missouri who resides outside the 81 boundaries of the United States or who is on active duty 82 with the Armed Forces of the United States or members of 83 their immediate family living with them may request an 84 absentee ballot for both the primary and subsequent general 85 election with one application.
- 86 (2) The election authority shall provide each absent 87 uniformed services voter and each overseas voter who submits 88 a voter registration application or an absentee ballot 89 request, if the election authority rejects the application 90 or request, with the reasons for the rejection.
- 91 (3) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, if 92 a standard oath regarding material misstatements of fact is

- adopted for uniformed and overseas voters pursuant to the Help America Vote Act of 2002, the election authority shall accept such oath for voter registration, absentee ballot, or other election-related materials.
- 97 Not later than sixty days after the date of each regularly scheduled general election for federal office, 98 each election authority which administered the election 99 100 shall submit to the secretary of state in a format 101 prescribed by the secretary a report on the combined number 102 of absentee ballots transmitted to, and returned by, absent 103 uniformed services voters and overseas voters for the 104 election. The secretary shall submit to the Election Assistance Commission a combined report of such information 105 106 not later than ninety days after the date of each regularly 107 scheduled general election for federal office and in a 108 standardized format developed by the commission pursuant to 109 the Help America Vote Act of 2002. The secretary shall make the report available to the general public. 110
 - (5) As used in this section, the terms "absent uniformed services voter" and "overseas voter" shall have the meaning prescribed in 52 U.S.C. Section 20310.
- 6. An application for an absentee ballot by a new 114 resident shall be submitted in person by the applicant in 115 116 the office of the election authority in the election 117 jurisdiction in which such applicant resides. The application shall be received by the election authority no 118 119 later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election. application shall be in the form of an affidavit, executed 120 in duplicate in the presence of the election authority or 121 122 any authorized officer of the election authority, and in substantially the following form: 123

[10.] 9. A notary public who charges more than the maximum fee specified or who charges or collects a fee for notarizing the signature on any absentee ballot or absentee voter registration is guilty of official misconduct."; and

Further amend said bill, pages 10 to 12, section 115.291, by striking all of said section from the bill and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"115.291. 1. Upon receiving an absentee ballot by mail, the voter shall mark the ballot in secret, place the ballot in the ballot envelope, seal the envelope and fill out the statement on the ballot envelope. The affidavit of each person voting an absentee ballot shall be subscribed and sworn to before the election official receiving the ballot, a notary public or other officer authorized by law to administer oaths, unless the voter is voting absentee due to incapacity or confinement due to the provisions of section 115.284, illness or physical disability, [for an election that occurs during the year 2020, the voter has contracted or is in an at-risk category for contracting or transmitting severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2, as defined in section 115.277,] or the voter is a covered voter as defined in section 115.902. If the voter is blind, unable to read or write the English language, or physically incapable of voting the ballot, the voter may be assisted by a person of the voter's own choosing. Any person assisting a voter who is not entitled to such assistance, and any person who assists a voter and in any manner coerces or initiates a request or a suggestion that the voter vote for or against or refrain from voting on any question, ticket or candidate, shall be guilty of a class one election offense.

- 467 If, upon counting, challenge or election contest, it is
- 468 ascertained that any absentee ballot was voted with unlawful
- 469 assistance, the ballot shall be rejected. [For purposes of
- 470 this subsection, the voters who are in an at-risk category
- 471 for contracting or transmitting severe acute respiratory
- 472 syndrome coronavirus 2 are voters who:
- 473 (1) Sixty-five years of age or older;
- 474 (2) Live in a long-term care facility licensed under
- 475 chapter 198;
- 476 (3) Have chronic lung disease or moderate to severe
- 477 asthma;
- 478 (4) Have serious heart conditions;
- 479 (5) Are immunocompromised;
- 480 (6) Have diabetes;
- 481 (7) Have chronic kidney disease and are undergoing
- 482 dialysis; or
- 483 (8) Have liver disease.]
- 484 2. Except as provided in subsection 4 of this section,
- 485 each absentee ballot that is not cast by the voter in person
- 486 in the office of the election authority shall be returned to
- 487 the election authority in the ballot envelope and shall only
- 488 be returned by the voter in person, or in person by a
- 489 relative of the voter who is within the second degree of
- 490 consanguinity or affinity, by mail or registered carrier or
- 491 by a team of deputy election authorities; except that
- 492 covered voters, when sent from a location determined by the
- 493 secretary of state to be inaccessible on election day, shall
- 494 be allowed to return their absentee ballots cast by use of
- 495 facsimile transmission or under a program approved by the
- 496 Department of Defense for electronic transmission of
- 497 election materials.
- 498 3. In cases of an emergency declared by the President
- 499 of the United States or the governor of this state where the

- 500 conduct of an election may be affected, the secretary of
 501 state may provide for the delivery and return of absentee
 502 ballots by use of a facsimile transmission device or
 503 system. Any rule promulgated pursuant to this subsection
 504 shall apply to a class or classes of voters as provided for
 505 by the secretary of state.
- 4. No election authority shall refuse to accept and process any otherwise valid marked absentee ballot submitted in any manner by a covered voter solely on the basis of restrictions on envelope type."; and
