- 115.160. 1. All Missouri driver's license applicants
 shall receive a voter registration application form as a
 simultaneous part of the application for a driver's license,
 renewal of driver's license, change of address, duplicate
 request and a nondriver's license.
- 2. If a single application form is used, the voter registration application portion of any application described in subsection 1 of this section may not require any information that duplicates information required in the driver's license portion of the form, except a second signature or other information required by law.
- 3. After conferring with the secretary of state as the 38 39 chief state election official responsible for overseeing of the voter registration process, the director of revenue 40 shall adopt rules and regulations pertaining to the format 41 42 of the voter registration application used by the department. The director of revenue shall utilize 43 44 electronic voter registration application forms and provide 45 for secure electronic transfer of voter registration information to election authorities. The secretary of state 46 and the director of revenue shall ensure the confidentiality 47 and integrity of the voter registration data collected, 48 maintained, received, or transmitted under this section. 49
 - 4. No information relating to the failure of an applicant for a driver's license or nondriver's license to sign a voter registration application may be used for any purpose other than voter registration.

5. Any voter registration application received
pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be
forwarded, in a secure and electronic manner, to the
election authority located within that county or any city
not within a county, or if there is more than one election
authority within the county, then to the election authority

In addition, one representative 146 appointed by the secretary of state's office shall serve on 147 148 the committee; 149 The committee shall immediately meet to approve (2) electronic signature formats and a minimum set of data 150 151 collection standards for use in a voter registration 152 application system maintained by the secretary of state; 153 Once the format and data collection standards are approved by the committee and implemented for the system 154 155 maintained by the secretary of state, local election authorities shall accept the transmission of voter 156 registration applications submitted to the approved system 157 158 under the provisions of sections 432.200 to 432.295;
