Gibbons Elected Majority Floor Leader

Following the Nov. 5 election, I was honored to be chosen majority floor leader. As floor leader, I will be responsible for scheduling debate, determining when bills will be heard on the Senate floor and moving the order of business that will come before the full chamber.

The 2003 legislative session will bring two important changes to state government in Missouri – a shift in party control of the Missouri Legislature and redrawing of Missouri House and Senate district lines.

The first change will have an effect on the entire state For the first time in more than 40 years, both houses of the General


