Sen. John Loudon is Appointed to State Insurance Commission

JEFFERSON CITY— Sen. John Loudon, R-Chesterfield, today announced that he has been appointed to a state commission by Senate President Pro Tem Michael Gibbons. Loudon is now a member of the State Employee Voluntary Life Insurance Commission.

“It is an honor to represent the Missouri State Senate in this capacity,” Loudon said. “I am confident my 10 years of experience as an insurance broker and legislator has prepared me for the work on this board.”

Loudon will serve as the only state senator on the five-member commission. The Voluntary Life Insurance Commission, which is part of the state Office of Administration, oversees a life insurance plan available to Missouri state employees. It is comprised of one member from the state House of Representatives, one from the Senate, and three who are appointed by the governor. Members serve three-year terms.

“The Voluntary Insurance Commission provides an important service to state workers,” Loudon said. “I am dedicated to furthering the duties of this commission and serving the employees of our great state.”
