Senators Announce New Resource Web Page for Educators

JEFFERSON CITY – A new source of information and resources for Missouri’s educators is now accessible at www.missourihelp.com. Sens. Charles B. Wheeler and Yvonne Wilson, both of the Kansas City area, announced today that the site was created to provide educators’ with information on federal and state services for educators as well as resources for classroom instruction.

“There are thousands of educators in Missouri who dedicate their time and support to our children,” said Wilson. “In an effort to make their lives a little easier, we hope that this web site will enable all of those professionals to easily access the information they need when they need it.”

The page is part of the new Missouri Senate Democratic Caucus web site Missourihelp.com. Because one of the main purposes of government is to provide services to constituents, the web site was created to help constituents easily find the local, state and federal governmental services they need.
