Senator-Elect Bill Stouffer Announces Capitol Office Staff

Has Assembled Capable, Experienced Team To Meet Needs of Constituents

JEFFERSON CITY – Senator-elect Bill Stouffer, R-Marshall, today announced that Aaron Baker of Atlanta, Heidi Osner of Lowry City, and Matt Michelson of Jefferson City will assist him in running his capitol office.

“These three are bright, energetic and enthusiastic young people interested in helping me make Missouri a better place to live, work and raise families,” Sen.-elect Stouffer said.

Heidi Osner joins Stouffer’s team as his administrative assistant after having served in State Senator Delbert Scott’s capitol office and helping secure decisive wins for a number of legislative candidates in last fall’s elections, including working for Representative-Elect Mike McGee of Odessa.

Also no stranger to the legislative process, Matt Michelson will join Stouffer’s team as a former volunteer on his campaign and intern to Senator John Loudon. Michelson will assist Stouffer with legislative and constituent services.

Macon County native Aaron Baker, who lives in Stouffer’s senate district, will serve as chief-of-staff. Baker, who also helped elect Stouffer last November, will play an integral role in setting the pace, tone and direction of the work to come in the new legislative session, which begins at noon on Jan. 5.
