Senator Bill Stouffer Rallies Support for 'Operation Girl Scout Cookie'

Coordinates Shipping of 270 Boxes of Girl Scout Cookies to Troops in Iraq

JEFFERSON CITY – Senator Bill Stouffer, R-Napton, rallied support in helping to ship nearly 300 boxes of Girl Scout cookies to U.S. troops stationed in Iraq.

"A group of young, energetic and caring constituents had a problem and I was more than glad to lend a hand," Stouffer said.

With this year's annual cookie drive season upon them, the 25 Girl Scouts of Maconarea *Becky Thatcher Group 507* decided to make an effort to sell extra boxes and send them to troops in Iraq. A glitch in the plan surfaced once the more than 200 boxes had been sold as the girls discovered it would cost \$2 a box to ship them overseas. Looking for a way to defray the unanticipated cost of more than \$400, Macon resident Jym Tuttle enlisted Senator Stouffer's help. Mr. Tuttle's wife, Brenda, leads the group, which includes their daughter, Sarah, as a member.

After meeting with a representative from UPS, Senator Stouffer arranged to have the boxes of overseas-bound Peanut Butter, Shortbreads and other cookies brought to the capitol. Senator Stouffer and his staff are now working up lists of Macon-area soldiers to receive the goods.
