Missouri's Foundation Formula

State Budget Reflects that Education is the Top Legislative Priority

Education is always an important issue to legislators, but this year it is uniquely important. On January 6, 2004 over 100 Missouri school districts jointly filed suit against the State of Missouri claiming that the state's current school-funding system was inadequate and inequitable. Since 1990, school funding has been determined using a foundation formula. The formula requires an evaluation of dozens of criteria, and districts receive more funding if certain objectives are met, ranging from improving student attendance to passing a bond election.

Over the past few months, members from both the House and the Senate met in a joint-committee to rewrite the 15-year-old foundation formula with the goal of improving the way money is distributed by the state. The proposed formula breaks down among school districts across the 27th Senatorial district as follows:

As you can see, under the proposed formula, school districts across the 27th Senatorial district will receive significantly more funding. The formula is a work in progress and no promises have been made yet. I talked much in the past few weeks about the tight fiscal situation that the state faces. My colleagues and I made many tough budget decisions in order to put ourselves in a position that we can increase funding to education. Even in these tight times, the Governor's budget for this upcoming fiscal year increases primary and secondary education funding by more than \$170 million. The formula itself proposes increasing school funding by at least \$660 million over the next five years.

I firmly believe that a strong education system is vital to the future of our state. Amazing things happen when a person stays in school and receives an education- they are more likely to stay out prison, teen pregnancy goes down, and drug and alcohol abuse goes falls. People that receive their High School diplomas are much more likely to become contributors to society rather than someone that is a drain on society's resources. These are just a few of the reasons that education is and will continue to be my top priority. I will continue to fight for schools to get the funding they need so that our children will receive the education they deserve.
