John Loudon was born in Ballwin, educated at Westminster College (B.A., 1989) and is currently doing post-graduate work specializing in Law and Government Policy studies in the J.D. program at Oak Brook College.

A Republican, John Loudon was elected to the House of Representatives in 1994, and re-elected in 1996 and 1998. He was elected to the Missouri Senate in 2000, serving as the youngest member, and was re-elected in 2004.

John has authored and passed several pieces of landmark legislation including passage of two Senate Bill #1s in 2005 (one in a Special Legislative Session).
