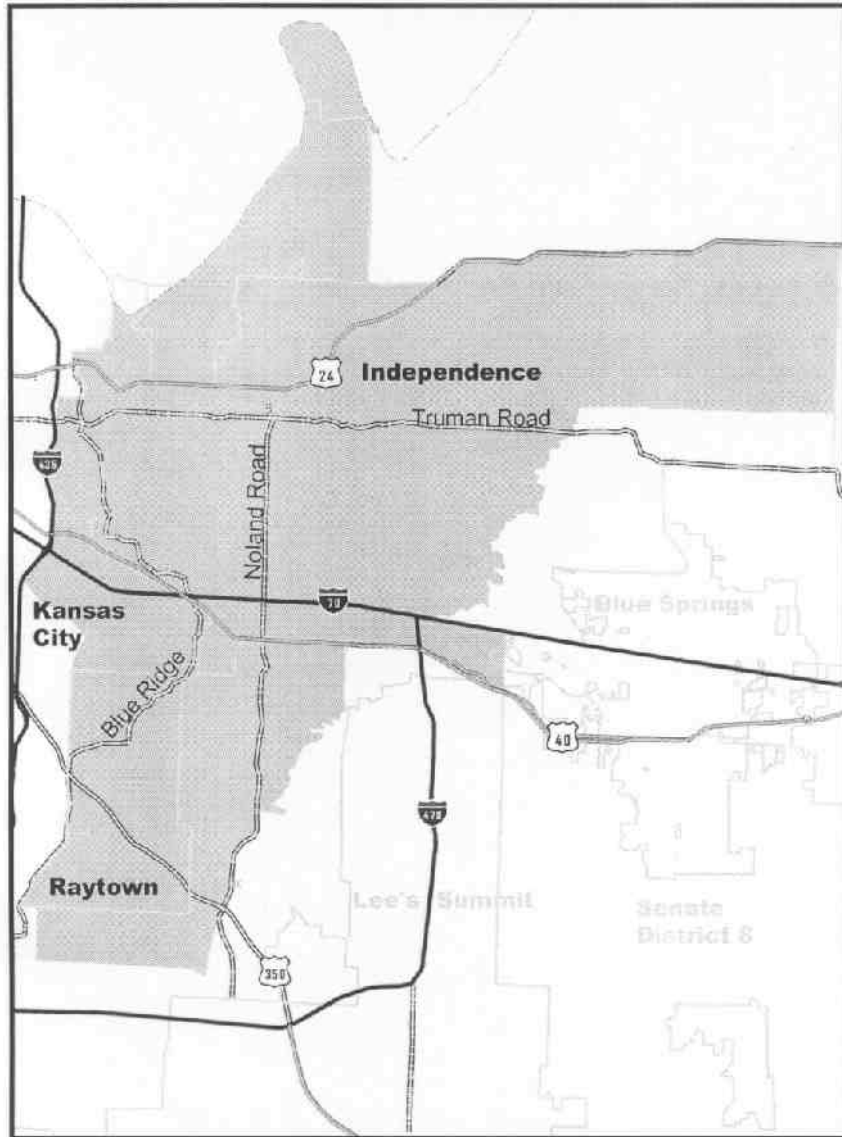

# 2006

## **LEGISLATIVE REPORT**

### **Eminent Domain**

#### **HB 1944**

**(Passed)**

This bill allows for more rights to be given to property owners and afforded them greater compensation for land taken by the government for public use. It requires that property owners be paid 25 percent over fair market value for property owned less than 50 years and 50 percent over fair market value for property owned 50 years or more. Although defining “blighted” areas is still an issue of contention, this bill is a good compromise that provides for added protections to property owners in Missouri.

### **Pay Raises – HJR 55**

**(Passed)**

**Election to be held in November 2006**

This measure, which will be put on the ballot in November 2006, establishes a constitutional amendment that would allow a “citizens’ commission”, appointed by the governor, to put into effect pay raises for judges and legislators unless blocked by 2/3, a supermajority, of lawmakers.

It is an outrageous attempt to remove accountability and the people of Missouri from the process. HJR 55 is designed to hoodwink and mislead the public. Proponents of this proposal

often decry that the Legislature has turned down pay increases for themselves in the past. HJR 55 greatly reduces the ability of the Legislature to turn down these pay raises. It creates a dangerous and self-serving mechanism that allows legislators to shirk their responsibility to the taxpayers and avoid any accountability for their decision.

The proponents of HJR 55 quite simply believe that it is good public policy for a supposedly fiscally-conservative Legislature to deny health care to over 100,000 disabled men, women, children and the elderly because of budget cuts, but at the same time, create a mechanism to almost automatically give themselves a pay raise.

I believe that the Legislature should live under the same conditions and economic uncertainties as every Missourian does every day. We should not be above or insulated from the conditions and hardships of our times. I have, and will continue to oppose this measure which abrogates your authority to hold elected officials accountable for their decisions.

## **Insurance Reform – HB 1837**

**(Passed)**

This bill requires insurers to report every year exactly how much they are charging for medical malpractice insurance and what they pay out in losses. Authority is given to the Department of Insurance to reject malpractice premium rates which are deemed excessive.

## **Medicaid Fraud – SB 1210**

**(Failed)**

This bill called for harsher punishments for medical providers who steal from the Medicaid program. It would have required those convicted of stealing over \$50,000 to serve prison time. Individuals caught stealing would be banned from using

the program. The bill also included encouragement for whistle blowers by allowing them to keep a percentage of the funds recovered.

## **HB 1022**

**(Failed)**



The Missouri Higher Education Loan Authority (MOHELA) had agreed to provide \$450 million to the state following a proposal to sell the entire agency. When it was found that the loan authority board had agreed to provide these funds without knowledge as to whether state law allowed such a payout and without a financial analysis to determine the affect on student borrowers or whether the authority could even afford the payments; the plan fell apart. MOHELA provides student loans to Missouri residents. This money is the students' money, and it should remain that way.

## **Ethanol – HB 1270**

**(Passed)**

This bill requires regular-grade gasoline that is sold in Missouri to contain 10 percent ethanol starting January 01, 2008. Ethanol is an alcohol product derived from crops such as corn.

I adamantly opposed this legislation. This act is a mandate for increases on already soaring gasoline prices. This equates to a tax increase on all Missouri motorists by eliminating consumer choice.



# Senior News

## HOMESTEAD ACT FULLY FUNDED

During the 2004 Legislative Session, the Missouri Senate passed the Homestead Preservation Act which created the Homestead Preservation Tax Credit (HPC) to provide much-needed property tax relief. This act allows qualified senior citizens and disabled individuals a credit on their real estate property tax if those taxes increase by 2.5 percent or more in a non-assessment year, or by 5 percent or more in a reassessment year. The credit would be for the amount that exceeds the 2.5 or 5 percent increase in taxes. This act required a legislative appropriation to fund the credit. The amount of the credit is based on a flat statewide percentage dependent upon the appropriation amount. I am pleased to inform you that HB 1004, passed by the Missouri Senate, **fully funded** this program for 2006. According to the Department of Revenue, almost \$3 million has been appropriated in order to provide 100 percent funding for this important program. This credit will now be applied against the property taxes for the calendar year following application.

The Senate has also passed SB 630, which modifies the eligibility requirements for properties owned by unmarried people as joint tenants or as tenants in common. If the property is owned by two or more unmarried individuals, each person with an ownership interest must individually satisfy the age or disability requirements for an eligible individual owner, and the combined income of all individuals with an ownership interest must not exceed \$75,000. If any one individual fails to satisfy these eligibility requirements, then all individuals with an ownership interest in the property will be deemed ineligible. The filing deadline has also been extended from September 30th to October 15th of each year.

## – SENIOR PROPERTY TAX – HALF-PAY PROGRAM

### What is the Senior Citizen &/or Disabled Half-Pay Program?

Senior citizens who qualify may elect to pay their real estate tax bill in two installments. The 1st installment is due by December 31 and the 2nd installment, with no interest or penalty, is due by Feb 28.

**NOTE:** This program is for **Real Estate** only.

### How do I qualify for the Senior Citizen Half-Pay Program?

- You must be 62 years of age or older.
- You must live at the address for which the taxes are being paid.
- To set up Senior Citizen Half-Pay Program for the first time, please contact the Jackson County Tax Helpline at 816-881-3232, or appear in person and present identification. Types of acceptable identification are a driver's license, state ID, birth certificate or Medicare card.
- All prior year taxes must be paid.
- You may also qualify if you are disabled. You must provide copies of your disability papers along with your payment.

## SENIOR CITIZENS' EXEMPTION TO LAWFUL PRESENCE

This year, the Missouri Senate passed SB 1001 which exempts persons 65 years of age or older who were previously issued a Missouri noncommercial driver's license, permit or non-driver's license from submitting proof of lawful presence. State law had previously required all individuals applying for a Missouri driver's license to provide proof of lawful presence; usually a birth certificate. Many seniors have found this practice to be a great inconvenience. This bill was passed to relieve seniors of the burden of locating a birth certificate.

## WHAT TO DO

### IF YOUR IDENTITY HAS BEEN STOLEN

**Step 1:** Place a “fraud alert” on your credit report and immediately review your credit report. Once you have a copy, review it for unexplained debts or accounts you didn’t open, and check to make sure your address and social security number are correct.

You can call the toll-free number of anyone of these major credit bureaus to place a fraud alert on your credit report:

Equifax – To report fraud, call: 1-800-525-6285

**Step 2:** Close all accounts that have been tampered with or opened fraudulently.

**Step 3:** File a report with the local police department or the police department where the identity theft took place.

**Step 4:** File a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission. To file a complaint, call 1-877-438-4338 or TDD (202) 326-2502.

### Elder Abuse : A Growing Problem

Senior citizens today are living healthier, more independent and active lives than ever before. Their contributions to our communities are countless. However, as this segment of our population grows, so do the challenges and hidden problems of elder abuse, neglect and exploitation. Every year, an estimated 450,000 older Americans fall victim to psychological, physical and other forms of abuse. However, experts estimate that for every case of abuse that is reported, as many as five cases are unreported.

## What Is Elder Abuse?

Elder abuse is defined by state laws and those definitions vary significantly from one jurisdiction to the next. However, there are a few basic categories of elder abuse: (1) Domestic elder abuse; (2) Institutional elder abuse; and (3) Self-abuse or self-neglect. If you suspect an adult is a victim of elder abuse, please report this to the Elder Abuse Hotline at 1-800-392-0210.

### How Can We Prevent Elder Abuse?

Everyone deserves to be treated with dignity, care and respect. Educating the public is the foundation for preventing abuse of the elderly. Increasing the availability of respite care and encouraging social interaction as well as support for families with dependent adults will help prevent this horrendous crime.

Unfortunately, many individuals and families are unaware of the numerous resources that are available to help them.

# **SHARED CARE**

## **A COMMUNITY NETWORK FOR CAREGIVER SUPPORT**

### **What Is Shared Care?**

Shared Care is a program in which families that provide care to an elderly family member in their home may request help to locate community and state supportive services.

Many families become involved in care giving with no clear picture of what services and options are available in their community and the state.

The program also provides assistance for existing support groups on the local level, and encourages sharing of information within the caregiver network at all levels.

### **How Do Care Providers Help?**

Shared Care offers care providers the opportunity to register as a resource agency for the list of resources provided to members. In return, care providers are encouraged to invite Shared Care members to attend free education and training sessions.

### **What Can Shared Care Do For Me?**

- You will have direct access to information about programs and services that may be available to help with your care giving needs;
- You will receive a yearly update of resources and care providers who have registered for the program;
- You may have the opportunity to receive training and education on various care giving issues, at no cost, if available in your community; and
- You may be eligible for a state tax credit.

### **How Do I Register For Shared Care?**

- Call the Division of Senior Services and Regulations toll-free at: 1-800-235-5503.
- A packet with a registration form and a list of resources will be mailed to you.
- Complete the registration form and mail it back.

### **Who May Be Eligible For A Tax Credit?**

- You may qualify for a tax credit of up to \$500 if:
- You provide care for a family member at least 60 years of age who is unable to live alone;
- You do not receive compensation for the care you provide;
- The family member is unable, or allowed, to operate a motor vehicle;
- The family member does not receive services paid for by Medicaid or Social Services Block Grant funds; and
- You are a registered member of the Shared Care program.

**If you believe you qualify for the credit, you may request a certification of need form which is completed by the elderly family member's physician and submitted with your Missouri income tax.**

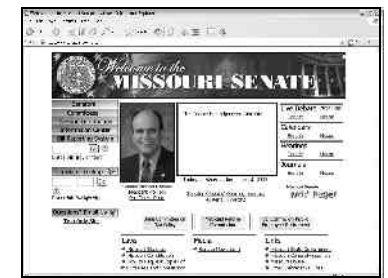

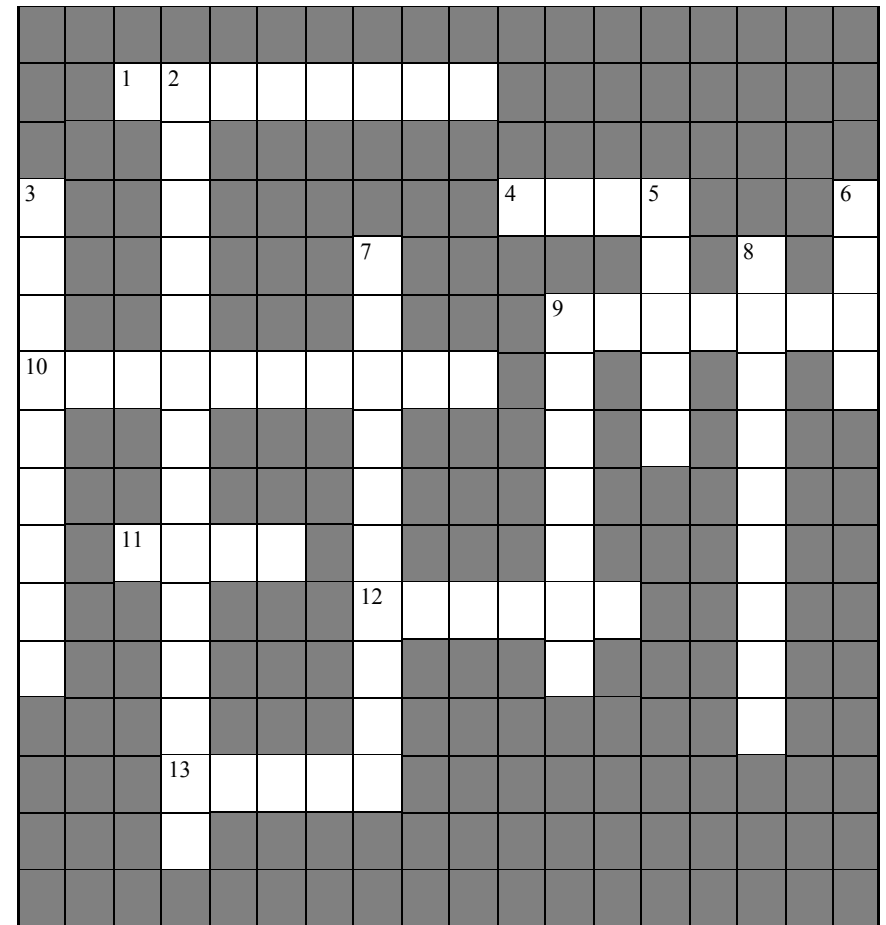

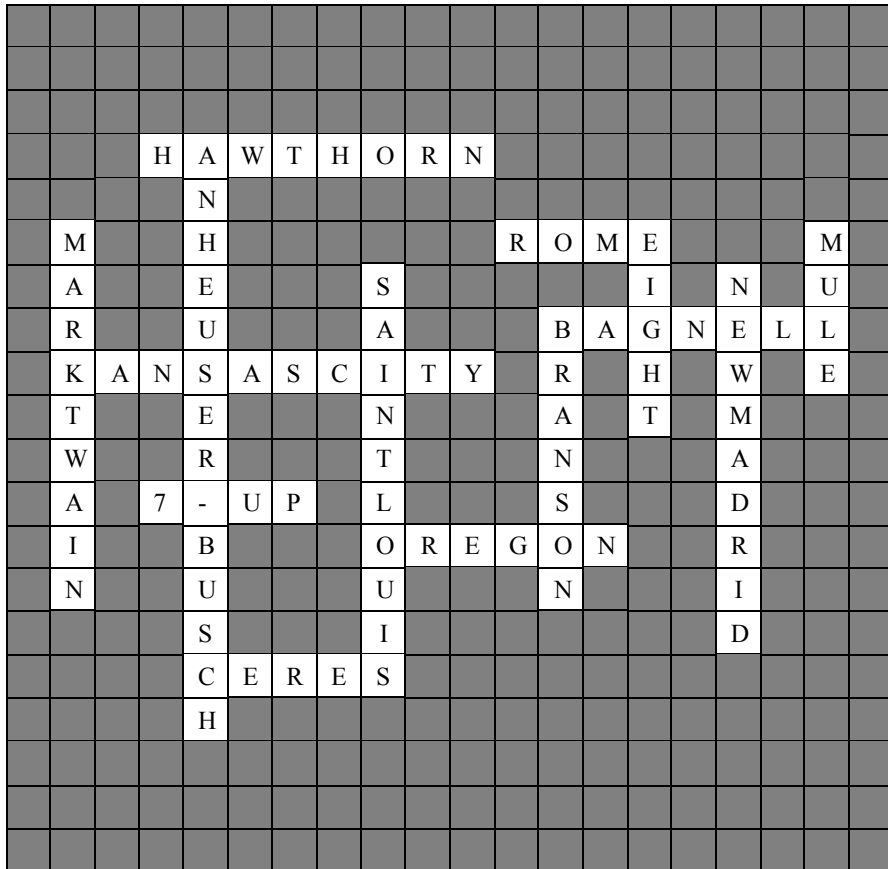
