Almost every American reaching age 65 today is eligible for Social Security benefits on that birthday. Check your eligibility with the nearest Social Security district office. Check at least 3 months before your 65th birthday. You may apply for these benefits at age 62 if you prefer, but early payment will reduce the monthly benefit amount for the rest of your life. Your Social Security district office can give you specific personal information. Take your Social Security card with you when you visit the SSA Office. The address of the closest SSA office is:

The Social Security office also makes determinations on claims for disability benefits. It pays benefits to people who are totally disabled either permanently or temporarily if they have worked five of the last ten years.

A new program has taken the place of the federal-state programs of public assistance payments to the aged, blind or disabled. You may apply for this assistance, called "supplemental security income payments," at the SSA office.

PROPERTY TAX RELIFE

The Missouri Department of Revenue administers two real estate assistance programs for qualified senior citizens and 100 percent disabled individuals, the **Missouri Property Tax Credit Claim (MO-PTC)** and the **Homestead Preservation Tax Credit (HPC)**. If you own and occupy your home, but your income restricts you from qualifying for the MO-PTC, you may be eligible for the HPC. You can only receive **ONE** of the credits. You should determine which tax credit program is more beneficial to you before you file for either credit. Please review the charts on the next 2 pages. 




DO YOU NEED ASSISTANCE IN SCHEDULING A SCHOOL CLASS TOUR?

The Missouri Property Tax Credit Claim is a program to give credit to certain senior citizens and 100% disabled individuals for a portion of the real estate taxes or rent they have paid for the year. The credit is for a maximum of \$750.00 and can only be claimed on the home they occupied during the period being claimed. The actual credit is based on amount paid and total household income.

This must be done by the third Wednesday prior to any election in order to vote in that particular election. After registering, you're eligible to vote in any election.
