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Typically, interns work during their winter semester in exchange for credit hours through their university. A link is available on my Missouri Senate Web site for high school and college students to apply for an intern or job shadow position. A full time internship requires more than 30 hours a week versus a part time internship, which requires less than 30 hours a week. A job shadowing experience, available to high school students, requires one week or less.

In the past, I have had students come to work for my office who have had a wide variety of backgrounds — from students studying agriculture to political science majors.
