The Missouri Department of
Transportation (MoDOT) has announced that
this summer will be one of its largest ever
construction seasons. This means that
travelers might face more delays and work
zones on their way to their vacation
destinations. A list of work zones in the state
by area is available online at www.modot.org
so you can be aware of possible delays on
your trip. MoDOT has also named the top

ten work zones for the summer season, which includes a construction area in the 27th Senate District. Crews will be working on a new interchange for Interstate 55 in Cape Girardeau, which could result in 10-15 minute delays as vehicles are diverted to exit ramps.

Drivers also need to be careful in work zones where long waits can lead to frustration. Construction crews are spending their days trying to improve Missouri's roadways, and drivers need to respect the speed limits and safety signs posted in work areas. Fines for speeding are doubled in these areas, and law enforcement will be watching the roadways.

Unfortunately, increased traffic means increased traffic accidents. One important way for you to make sure that the entire family arrives at their destination safe is to buckle up. Law enforcement officers will be keeping an eye on drivers this summer with particular attention given to safety belt and child restraint laws. Not only is wearing a seat belt the law, it can be the difference between life and death in a serious accident.



Summer is a time for celebration and many people will be spending time at gatherings where alcohol is served. Last year, there were 90 fatalities in Southeast Missouri due to impaired driving. Each of these deaths could have been prevented, and there is no reason why anyone should get behind the wheel after drinking. Sobriety checkpoints throughout the state will be trying to catch those who are driving while under the influence, but a difference can also be made by using common sense and by looking out for friends and neighbors. If a friend has been drinking, don't let them drive home.
