AN ACT

To repeal sections 195.503 and 650.120, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to Internet sex crimes against children, with an emergency clause.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 195.503 and 650.120, RSMo, are repealed and two new

- 2 sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 195.503 and 650.120, to

195.503. As used in sections 195.501 to 195.511, the following terms

- 2 mean:
- 3 (1) "Department", the department of public safety;
- 4 (2) "Director", the director of the department of public safety;
- 5 (3) "Drug laws", all laws regulating the production, sale, prescribing,
- 6 manufacturing, administering, transporting, having in possession, dispensing,
- 7 distributing, or use of controlled substances, as defined in section 195.010;
- 8 (4) "Multijurisdictional enforcement group", or "MEG", a combination of
- 9 political subdivisions established under sections 573.500 and 573.503, RSMo,
- 10 section 178.653, RSMo, and section 311.329, RSMo, to [enforce the drug laws of
- 11 this state investigate and enforce computer, Internet-based, narcotics,
- 12 and drug violations.

650.120. 1. Subject to appropriation, the department of public safety shall

- 2 create a program to distribute grants to multijurisdictional Internet cyber crime
- 3 law enforcement task forces, multijurisdictional enforcement groups, as
- 4 defined in section $195.503,\,\mathrm{RSMo},\,\mathrm{that}$ are investigating Internet sex
- 5 crimes against children, and other law enforcement agencies. Not more

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department to pay the administrative costs of the grant program. The
grants shall be awarded and used to pay the salaries of detectives and computer
forensic personnel whose focus is investigating Internet sex crimes against
children, including but not limited to enticement of a child, possession or
promotion of child pornography, [and to] provide funding for the training of law
enforcement personnel, and purchase necessary equipment. The funding for
such training may be used to cover the travel expenses of those persons
participating. The grants shall not be awarded and used to pay any cost
associated with investigating violations and enforcing the provisions
of chapter 195, RSMo.

- 2. A panel is hereby established in the department of public safety to award grants under this program and shall be comprised of the following members:
 - (1) The director of the department of public safety, or his or her designee;
- 21 (2) Two members shall be appointed by the director of the department of 22 public safety from a list of six nominees submitted by the Missouri Police Chiefs 23 Association;
- 24 (3) Two members shall be appointed by the director of the department of 25 public safety from a list of six nominees submitted by the Missouri Sheriffs' 26 Association;
- 27 (4) Two members of the state highway patrol shall be appointed by the 28 director of the department of public safety from a list of six nominees submitted 29 by the Missouri State Troopers Association;
- 30 (5) One member of the house of representatives who shall be appointed 31 by the speaker of the house of representatives; and
- 32 (6) One member of the senate who shall be appointed by the president pro 33 tem.

The panel members who are appointed under subdivisions (2), (3), and (4) of this 34subsection shall serve a four-year term ending four years from the date of 35 expiration of the term for which his or her predecessor was appointed. However, 36 a person appointed to fill a vacancy prior to the expiration of such a term shall 3738be appointed for the remainder of the term. Such members shall hold office for 39 the term of his or her appointment and until a successor is appointed. The 40 members of the panel shall receive no additional compensation but shall be eligible for reimbursement for mileage directly related to the performance of 41

42 panel duties.

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- 3. Local matching amounts, which may include new or existing funds or in-kind resources including but not limited to equipment or personnel, are required for multijurisdictional Internet cyber crime law enforcement task forces and other law enforcement agencies to receive grants awarded by the panel. Such amounts shall be determined by the state appropriations process or by the panel.
- 48 4. When awarding grants, priority should be given to newly hired 49 detectives and computer forensic personnel.
 - 5. The panel shall establish minimum training standards for detectives and computer forensic personnel participating in the grant program established in subsection 1 of this section.
 - 6. Multijurisdictional Internet cyber crime law enforcement task forces and other law enforcement agencies participating in the grant program established in subsection 1 of this section shall share information and cooperate with the highway patrol and with existing Internet Crimes Against Children task force programs.
- 7. The panel may make recommendations to the general assembly regarding the need for additional resources or appropriations.
 - 8. The power of arrest of any peace officer who is duly authorized as a member of a multijurisdictional Internet cyber crime law enforcement task force shall only be exercised during the time such peace officer is an active member of such task force and only within the scope of the investigation on which the task working. Notwithstanding other provisions of law to the contrary, such task force officer shall have the power of arrest, as limited in this subsection, anywhere in the state and shall provide prior notification to the chief of police of the municipality in which the arrest is to take place or the sheriff of the county if the arrest is to be made in his or her venue. If exigent circumstances exist, such arrest may be made and notification shall be made to the chief of police or sheriff as appropriate and as soon as practical. The chief of police or sheriff may elect to work with the multijurisdictional Internet cyber crime law enforcement task force at his or her option when such task force is operating within the jurisdiction of such chief of police or sheriff.
 - 9. Under section 23.253, RSMo, of the Missouri sunset act:
 - (1) The provisions of the new program authorized under this section shall

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sunset automatically six years after June 5, 2006, unless reauthorized by an actof the general assembly; and

- (2) If such program is reauthorized, the program authorized under this section shall sunset automatically twelve years after the effective date of the reauthorization of this section; and
- 83 (3) This section shall terminate on September first of the calendar year 84 immediately following the calendar year in which the program authorized under 85 this section is sunset.

Section B. Because of the need to protect the citizens of this state, section

2 A of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

3 health, welfare, peace and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act

4 within the meaning of the constitution, and section A of this act shall be in full

5 force and effect upon its passage and approval.
