February 16, 2008, the *Kansas City Star* printed an article that advised the Lakewood Elementary students, parents and surrounding neighborhoods that their school was slated to be closed. Proud parents and community members young and old came to the rescue. The school district held a public meeting that was attended by former students, neighborhood residents and the local media. After 50 days of debate and discussion, the school board decided to not close the school.

The school enrollment levels were higher than expected by the district this year and it appears that the neighborhood is an attractive option for affordable homes closer to working centers and transit lines. This was the second time in the last 20 years that the neighborhood saved the school. Like the Little Red Engine, we believe optimism is a great lesson to teach our kids.
