Our interns and job shadows must be able to mesh with our office and offer valuable judgment regarding issues that affect our constituents.

Typically, interns work during their winter semester in exchange for credit hours through their university. A link is available on my Senate website for high school and college students to apply for an intern or job shadow position. A full time internship requires more than 30 hours a week versus a part time internship, which requires fewer than 30 hours a week. A job shadowing experience, which is available to high school students, requires one week or less.

In the past, I have had students come to work for my office who have had a wide variety of backgrounds — from students studying agriculture to political science majors.
