Send a message to our troops. The easiest way to send a note of thank you and encouragement to our troops is to send a message online. The Department of Defense has a service set up that will allow you to post a note for service members to read at <a href="https://www.americasupportsyou.com">www.americasupportsyou.com</a>— the official Department of Defense web site encouraging support of U.S. Military troops around the world. You can write your message by clicking on the "Thank the Troops" link. (Note: The Department of Defense no longer accepts unsolicited mail, so if you choose to send a letter to a service member, do so through one of the many organizations, such as <a href="https://www.soldierangels.com">www.soldierangels.com</a>, that help send letters and packages abroad.

## Make a donation.

There are a variety of non-profit groups that accept donations—and not just the standard items we often think of. Frequent flyer miles, gift certificates, vehicles, and phone cards are all
