То	AN ACT amend chapter 338, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to prohibiting the interchange of anti-epileptic drugs.
Be i	t enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:
	Section A. Chapter 338, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new
2	section, to be known as section 338.058, to read as follows:
	338.058. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms shall
2	mean:
3	(1) "Anti-epileptic drug", any drug prescribed for the treatment
4	of epilepsy or the treatment or prevention of seizures;
5	(2) "Epilepsy", a neurological condition characterized by
6	recurrent seizures;
7	(3) "Interchange", the substitution of one version of an anti-
8	epileptic drug for the anti-epileptic drug originally prescribed,
9	including:
10	(a) A generic for the prescribed brand;
11	(b) A brand for the prescribed drug;
12	(c) A generic by one manufacturer for a generic by a different
13	manufacturer;
14	(d) A different formulation of the prescribed anti-epileptic drug;
15	or
16	(e) A different anti-epileptic drug;
17	(4) "Seizure", an acute clinical change secondary to a brief
18	disturbance in the electrical activity of the brain.

Notwithstanding section 338.056 to the contrary, a pharmacist,
pharmacist technician, or pharmacy intern filling any prescription for

21any drug that has been prescribed for the treatment of epilepsy that denotes that the drug is from a specific manufacturer, be it generic or 22name brand, shall not interchange the drug for any from another 23manufacturer other than the one specified in the prescription, unless 24the patient is notified of the interchange, in writing or verbally, upon 25the delivery of the prescription. If such drug is interchanged with 26notice to the patient, the pharmacist, pharmacist technician, or 27pharmacy intern who fills such prescription shall also notify the 2829prescribing physician or physician's agent within forty-eight hours of the delivery of the prescription. This requirement shall not apply to 30 prescriptions dispensed for inpatients of a hospital, nursing home, 31assisted living facility, or inpatients of a mental health or residential 3233 facility.
