AN ACT

To amend chapters 167 and 376, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to immunizations against the human papillomavirus.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapters 167 and 376, RSMo, are amended by adding thereto 2 two new sections, to be known as sections 167.182 and 376.1252, to read as 3 follows:

167.182. 1. Each parent or guardian of a female student enrolling
2 in grade six shall be provided information regarding immunizations
3 against the human papillomavirus in accordance with this section.

2. (1) Each public school district shall provide the names and addresses of all parents and guardians of female students who are entering grade six to the department of health and senior services and the department shall mail to such parent or guardian age appropriate information relating to the connection between human papillomavirus and cervical cancer, and that an immunization against the human papillomavirus infection is available.

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(2) Such information shall include:

(a) The risk factors for developing cervical cancer, the symptoms
of the disease, how it may be diagnosed and its possible consequences
if untreated;

15 (b) The connection between human papillomavirus and cervical 16 cancer, how human papillomavirus is transmitted, how transmission 17 may be prevented, including abstinence as the best way to prevent 18 sexually transmitted diseases, and the relative risk of contracting 19 human papillomavirus for primary and secondary school students; (c) The latest scientific information on the immunization against
human papillomavirus infection and the immunization's effectiveness
against causes of cervical cancer;

23 (d) That a pap smear is still critical for the detection of
24 precancerous changes in the cervix to allow for treatment before
25 cervical cancer develops; and

(e) A statement that any questions or concerns regarding
immunizing the child against human papillomavirus could be answered
by contacting a health care provider.

(3) Each informational mailing sent to the parents or guardian of female students who are entering grade six shall request that the parents or guardian of such students voluntarily furnish to the department not later than twenty school days after the first day of school a written statement, in a form prescribed by the department of health and senior services, stating that the parent has received the information required under this subsection and that:

36 (a) The student has received or is receiving the immunization;
37 or

(b) The parent has decided not to have the student immunized.
Such form to be returned voluntarily by the parent or guardian shall
not request from the parent or guardian any identifying information of
the female student or parent or guardian.

42(4) The informational mailing shall have prominently displayed in bold type that the request from the parent or guardian for the 43written statement under subdivision (3) of this subsection is voluntary. 44(5) Beginning July 1, 2009, the department shall submit to the 4546 general assembly a report detailing the number of sixth grade female 47students who have and have not been immunized against the human papillomavirus infection and the number of non-responses to the 48request for the written statement under subdivision (3) of this 49subsection. The information derived from subdivision (3) of this 50subsection shall be used for statistical purposes only and shall not be 51used to personally identify any parent or guardian, or any student. 52

53 (6) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to prevent a 54 student from school attendance if such parent or guardian has opted 55 not to have the student receive the human papillomavirus 56 immunization or has not returned the statement prescribed in 57 subdivision (3) of this subsection.

583. If a parent or guardian chooses to have the female student 59immunized for the human papillomavirus but is unable to pay, the student shall be immunized at public expense by a physician or nurse 60 at or from the county, district, city public health center or a school 61nurse or by a nurse or physician in the private office or clinic of the 62 child's personal physician with the costs of immunization paid through 63 the Mo HealthNet program, private insurance or in a manner to be 64 determined by the department of health and senior services subject to 65 state and federal appropriations. 66

4. Funds for the administration of this section and for the purchase of vaccines for students of families unable to afford them shall be appropriated to the department of health and senior services from general revenue or from federal funds if available.

5. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 7172536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to 73 74all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 75536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable 76and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to 77chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, 78 79then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or 80 adopted after August 28, 2008, shall be invalid and void.

376.1252. 1. All individual and group health insurance policies providing coverage on an expense-incurred basis, individual and group 23 service or indemnity type contracts issued by a health services corporation, individual and group service contracts issued by a health 4 maintenance organization, and all self-insured group arrangements to 5the extent not preempted by federal law and all managed health care 6 delivery entities of any type or description shall provide coverage for 7 inoculations to fully immunize females who are not less than eleven 8 years of age but not more than twenty-one years of age against the 9 10 human papillomavirus.

2. Such coverage shall be in full and not subject to any
deductible or copayment limits.

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3. This section shall not apply to supplemental insurance

- 14 policies, including life care contracts, accident-only policies, specified
- 15 disease policies, hospital policies, coverage issued as a supplement to
- 16 liability insurance, short-term major medical policies of six months or
- 17 less duration, and other supplemental policies as determined by the

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18 department of insurance.
