## AN ACT

To repeal section 116.080, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to petition circulators, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

concurrently shall not be counted.

Section A. Section 116.080, RSMo, is repealed and one new section

enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 116.080, to read as follows: 116.080. 1. Each petition circulator shall be at least eighteen years of age, a citizen of the United States, a Missouri resident, and registered with the secretary of state. No person shall qualify as a petition circulator who has been convicted of, or found guilty of, or pled guilty to an offense involving forgery under the laws of this state, or an offense under the laws of any other jurisdiction if that offense would be considered 7 forgery under the laws of this state. No petition circulator shall be paid on a per signature basis, receive any signature by mail or via the 9 Internet, or circulate more than one petition concurrently. Signatures 10 collected by any circulator who has not registered with the secretary of state pursuant to this chapter [on or before 5:00 p.m. on the final day for filing 11 petitions with the secretary of statel prior to the collection of such 13 signatures shall not be counted. - 22 (2) Name of circulator and proof of United States citizenship;
- 23 (3) Residential address, including street number, city, state and zip code,
- 24 and proof of Missouri resident status;
- 25 (4) Mailing address, if different;
- 26 (5) [Have you been or] Do you expect to be paid for soliciting signatures
- 27 for this petition?

- 29 (6) If the answer to subdivision (5) is yes, then identify the payor;
- 30 (7) Signature of circulator.
- 3. The circulator information required in subsection 2 of this section shall
- 32 be submitted to the secretary of state's office with the following oath and

- 34 I HEREBY SWEAR OR AFFIRM UNDER PENALTY OF PERJURY THAT
- 35 ALL STATEMENTS MADE BY ME ARE TRUE AND CORRECT, THAT I HAVE
- 36 NEVER BEEN CONVICTED OF, FOUND GUILTY OF, OR PLED GUILTY
- 37 TO ANY OFFENSE INVOLVING FORGERY. I HEREBY SWEAR OR
- 38 AFFIRM UNDER PENALTY OF LAW THAT I AM LEGALLY
- 39 RESPONSIBLE FOR MY SIGNATURE GATHERING ACTIVITIES AND
- 40 MAY BE HELD LEGALLY RESPONSIBLE FOR FRAUDULENT OR
- 41 DECEPTIVE SIGNATURE GATHERING PRACTICES. I HEREBY SWEAR
- 42 OR AFFIRM UNDER PENALTY OF LAW THAT I WILL NOT BE PAID ON
- 43 A PER SIGNATURE BASIS FOR THE COLLECTION OF ANY
- 44 SIGNATURE, RECEIVE ANY SIGNATURE BY MAIL OR VIA THE
- 45 INTERNET, OR CIRCULATE MORE THAN ONE PETITION
- 46 CONCURRENTLY.
- 4. Each petition circulator shall subscribe and swear to the proper
- 48 affidavit on each petition page such circulator submits before a notary public
- 49 commissioned in Missouri. When notarizing a circulator's signature, a notary
- 50 public shall sign his or her official signature and affix his or her official seal to
- 51 the affidavit only if the circulator personally appears before the notary and
- 52 subscribes and swears to the affidavit in his or her presence.

53 5. Any circulator who falsely swears to a circulator's affidavit knowing it 54 to be false, receives payment for collecting signatures on a per signature 55 basis, receives any signature by mail or via the Internet, or circulates 56 more than one petition concurrently is guilty of a class A misdemeanor 57 punishable, notwithstanding the provisions of section 560.021, RSMo, to the 58 contrary, for a term of imprisonment not to exceed one year in the county jail or 59 a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars or both.
