## AN ACT

To repeal section 163.172, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to teacher compensation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 163.172, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 163.172, to read as follows:

163.172. 1. [In school year 1994-95 and thereafter until school year

2 2006-07, the minimum teacher's salary shall be eighteen thousand

 $3\,$  dollars. Beginning in school year 2006-07, the minimum teacher's salary shall

4 be twenty-two thousand dollars; in school year 2007-08, the minimum teacher's

5 salary shall be twenty-three thousand dollars; in school year 2008-09, the

6 minimum teacher's salary shall be twenty-four thousand dollars; in school year

7 2009-10 and thereafter, the minimum teacher's salary shall be twenty-five

8 thousand dollars. Beginning in the school year 1996-97 until school year 2006-07,

9 for any full-time teacher with a master's degree and at least ten years' teaching

10 experience in a public school or combination of public schools, the minimum

11 salary shall be twenty-four thousand dollars. Beginning in the school year

12 2006-07, for any full-time teacher with a master's degree in an academic teaching

13 field and at least ten years' teaching experience in a public school or combination

14 of public schools, the minimum salary shall be thirty thousand dollars; in the

15 2007-08 school year such minimum salary shall be thirty-one thousand dollars;

16 in the 2008-09 school year such minimum salary shall be thirty-two thousand

 $\,$  17  $\,$  dollars; and in the 2009-10 school year such minimum salary shall be thirty-three

18 thousand dollars.

19 2. Beginning with the budget requests for fiscal year 1991,] As used in

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- this section, the following terms shall mean: 20
- 21 (1) "Full-time", a teacher working under school district contract 22or for a state school for the severely handicapped, state school for the deaf, or state school for the blind for all school days and hours eligible 2324 for attendance of students;
- 25 (2) "Minimum salary supplement", the difference between the school district's salary schedule and the minimum salary set out in 26subdivision (1) of subsection 4 of this section, based on years of 27 28 teaching experience and the most advanced academic degree held by the teacher: 29
- (3) "Regular school term", a minimum of one hundred seventy-30 four days and one thousand forty-four hours of pupil attendance 31 possible for students; 32
- 33 (4) "Salary", the salary amount which appears on the teacher's contract for the regular school term. Such term does not include 34 supplements for extra duties, summer school, career ladder, or 35 extensions of the contract year. The minimum salary supplement shall 36 37 be included in the calculation of "final average salary" under 38 subdivision (8) of section 169.010, RSMo;
  - (5) "Teacher", all certificated school district personnel who are eligible for tenure and are paid pursuant to the school district teacher salary schedule, including but not limited to teachers, librarians, counselors, and career education instructors.
- 2. There is hereby established the Minimum Salary for Teachers Program. Beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, the general assembly shall make an annual appropriation to the minimum salary fund for teachers established in subsection 3 of this section for the 47purpose of paying public school teacher minimum salary supplements in those districts meeting the qualifications established in subsection 48 4 of this section. A participating school district shall be responsible 49 only for the contracted amount of a teacher's salary. If the 50 appropriation of the general assembly is insufficient to pay the total 51cost of all salary supplements, the minimum salary amounts of 52subsection 4 of this section shall be prorated until the amount appropriated is sufficient to make the payments to all participating school districts.
  - 3. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Minimum

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57 Salary Fund for Teachers" to fund the minimum teacher salaries 58 provided for in this section. The state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, RSMo, the 59 state treasurer may approve disbursements from the fund. Upon 60 appropriation, money in the fund shall be used solely for the 61 administration of this section. Notwithstanding the provisions of 62 section 33.080, RSMo, to the contrary, any moneys remaining in the 63 fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the 64 general revenue fund. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the 65 fund in the same manner as other funds are invested. Any interest and 66 moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund. 67

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- 4. To make application and qualify to begin receiving funds under subsection 1 of this section, a school district shall:
- (1) Regardless of where a teacher is placed on a local salary schedule, recognize all years of teacher experience, including but not limited to employment in out-of-state schools, private schools, and public charter schools:

85 (2) Be subject to a local effort requirement. The local effort shall 86 be calculated based on the percentage of expenditures from the 87 teachers and incidental funds attributable to the base salary, 88 retirement, and health care costs of the teachers covered under the 89 minimum salary supplement program. A district may vary from its 10 local effort percentage based on its combined unrestricted fund balance 81 as of June thirtieth of the previous year as follows:

The department of elementary and secondary education shall deduct, in the next fiscal year, a corresponding dollar amount of the minimum salary supplement for a district that varies more than the allowable percentage from its local effort percentage.

- 5. Future increases in minimum salaries established under subsection 4 of this section shall be contingent upon decreases in total state payments to all districts made under subsection 4 of this section. In the second fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the state cost of funding the minimum salary for teachers program is eighty-five percent or less of the full funding cost for the first school year of the state funding of minimum salaries for teachers under subsection 4 of this section, the value of each level of minimum salary shall be increased by five hundred dollars.
- 6. The commissioner of education shall present to the appropriate committees of the general assembly information on the average Missouri teacher's salary, regional average salary data, and national average salary data.
- [3.] 7. All school salary information shall be public information.
- [4. As used in this section, the term "salary" shall be defined as the salary figure which appears on the teacher's contract and as determined by the local school district's basic salary schedule and does not include supplements for extra duties.
- 5. The minimum salary for any fully certificated teacher employed on a less than full-time basis by a school district, state school for the severely handicapped, the Missouri School for the Deaf, or the Missouri School for the Blind shall be prorated to reflect the amounts provided in subsection 1 of this section.]
  - 8. The state board of education shall issue rules and regulations as necessary for the efficient and effective implementation of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in this

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130 section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 131 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable 132133 and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, or to 134 135 disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or 136 adopted after August 28, 2008, shall be invalid and void. 137

- 9. Pursuant to section 23.253, RSMo, of the Missouri sunset act:
- (1) The provisions of the new program authorized under this section shall sunset automatically six years after the effective date of this section unless reauthorized by an act of the general assembly; and
- (2) If such program is reauthorized, the program authorized under this section shall sunset automatically twelve years after the effective date of the reauthorization of this section; and
- 145 (3) This section shall terminate on September first of the 146 calendar year immediately following the calendar year in which the 147 program authorized under this section is sunset.
