AN ACT

To repeal section 163.172, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to educational personnel compensation, with an emergency clause.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 163.172, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 163.172, to read as follows:

163.172. 1. [In school year 1994-95 and thereafter until school year 2006-07, the minimum teacher's salary shall be eighteen thousand $\mathbf{2}$ 3 dollars. Beginning in school year 2006-07, the minimum teacher's salary shall be twenty-two thousand dollars; in school year 2007-08, the minimum teacher's 4 salary shall be twenty-three thousand dollars; in school year 2008-09, the 5minimum teacher's salary shall be twenty-four thousand dollars; in school year 6 2009-10 and thereafter, the minimum teacher's salary shall be twenty-five 7 thousand dollars. Beginning in the school year 1996-97 until school year 2006-07, 8 for any full-time teacher with a master's degree and at least ten years' teaching 9 10 experience in a public school or combination of public schools, the minimum salary shall be twenty-four thousand dollars. Beginning in the school year 11 122006-07, for any full-time teacher with a master's degree in an academic teaching field and at least ten years' teaching experience in a public school or combination 1314 of public schools, the minimum salary shall be thirty thousand dollars; in the 2007-08 school year such minimum salary shall be thirty-one thousand dollars; 1516 in the 2008-09 school year such minimum salary shall be thirty-two thousand dollars; and in the 2009-10 school year such minimum salary shall be thirty-three 1718 thousand dollars.

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2. Beginning with the budget requests for fiscal year 1991,] As used in

20 this section, the following terms mean:

(1) "Full-time", a teacher working under school district contract
or for a state school for the severely handicapped, state school for the
deaf, or state school for the blind for all school days and hours eligible
for attendance of students;

25 (2) "Minimum salary supplement", the difference between the 26 school district's salary schedule and the minimum salary set out in 27 subdivision (1) of subsection 4 of this section, based on years of 28 teaching experience and the most advanced academic degree held by 29 the teacher;

30 (3) "Regular school term", a minimum of one hundred
31 seventy-four days and one thousand forty-four hours of pupil
32 attendance possible for students;

(4) "Salary", the salary amount which appears on the teacher's
contract for the regular school term. Such term does not include
supplements for extra duties, summer school, career ladder, or
extensions of the contract year. The minimum salary supplement shall
be included in the calculation of "final average salary" under
subdivision (8) of section 169.010, RSMo;

39 (5) "Teacher", all certificated school district personnel who are
40 eligible for tenure and are paid pursuant to the school district teacher
41 salary schedule, including but not limited to teachers, librarians,
42 counselors, and career education instructors.

432. Beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, the general assembly shall make an annual appropriation to the minimum salary 44 fund for teachers established in subsection 3 of this section for the 4546 purpose of paying public school teacher minimum salary supplements in those districts meeting the qualifications established in subsection 474 of this section. A participating school district shall be responsible 48only for the contracted amount of a teacher's salary. If the 49appropriation of the general assembly is insufficient to pay the total 50cost of all salary supplements, the minimum salary amounts of 51subsection 4 of this section shall be prorated until the amount 52appropriated is sufficient to make the payments to all participating 53school districts. 54

55 3. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Minimum 56 Salary Fund for Teachers" to fund the minimum teacher salaries

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provided for in this section. The state treasurer shall be custodian of 5758the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, RSMo, the state treasurer may approve disbursements. Upon appropriation, 59money in the fund shall be used solely for the administration of this 60 section. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080, RSMo, to the 61 contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium 62 shall not revert to the credit of the general revenue fund. The state 63 treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other 64 funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such 65 investments shall be credited to the fund. 66

4. To make application and qualify to begin receiving funds
under subsection 1 of this section, a school district shall:

(1) Regardless of where a teacher is placed on a local salary
schedule, recognize all years of teacher experience, including but not
limited to employment in out-of-state schools, private schools, and
public charter schools:

The one-to-three year bracket amount shall be multiplied by the dollar value modifier, as defined in section 163.031, for the district and in the case of state-operated schools, the district in which the state-operated school is located. In subsequent three-year brackets, the minimum salary level times the dollar value modifier shall increase by the following percentages of the one-to-three year bracket amount:

91 (2) Be subject to a local effort requirement. The local effort shall
92 be calculated based on the percentage of expenditures from the
93 teachers and incidental funds attributable to the base salary,

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retirement, and health care costs of the teachers covered under the 9495minimum salary supplement program. A district may vary from its local effort percentage based on its combined unrestricted fund balance 96as of June thirtieth of the previous year, as follows:

The department shall deduct, in the next fiscal year, a corresponding 106dollar amount of the minimum salary supplement for a district that 107varies more than the allowable percentage from its local effort 108 109percentage.

5. Future increases in minimum salaries established under 110 111 subsection 4 of this section shall be contingent upon decreases in total 112state payments to all districts made under subsection 4 of this section. 113In the second fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the state 114cost of funding the minimum salary program is eighty-five percent or less of the full funding cost for the first school year of the state funding 115116 of minimum salaries for teachers under subsection 4 of this section, the value of the base level of minimum salary, represented by the one-to-117 three year bracket amount, shall be increased by five hundred dollars. 1186. The commissioner of education shall present to the appropriate 119120committees of the general assembly information on the average Missouri teacher's salary, regional average salary data, and national average salary data. 121

122[3.] 7. All school salary information shall be public information.

123[4. As used in this section, the term "salary" shall be defined as the salary figure which appears on the teacher's contract and as determined by the local 124school district's basic salary schedule and does not include supplements for extra 125126duties.

1275. The minimum salary for any fully certificated teacher employed on a less than full-time basis by a school district, state school for the severely 128129handicapped, the Missouri School for the Deaf, or the Missouri School for the Blind shall be prorated to reflect the amounts provided in subsection 1 of this 130

131 section.]

1328. The state board of education shall issue rules and regulations as necessary for the efficient and effective implementation of this 133section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 134536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in this 135section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to 136all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 137536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable 138139 and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, or to 140disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, 141then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or 142adopted after August 28, 2008, shall be invalid and void. 143

Section B. Because immediate action is necessary to synchronize the requirements of section A of this act with the school calendar and state fiscal year, section A of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, peace, and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of the constitution, and section A of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval.

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
