AN ACT

To amend chapter 376, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to limited mandate health insurance policies.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 376, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 376.996, to read as follows:

376.996. 1. As used in this section, the following terms mean:

(1) "Limited mandate health insurance policy", a basic health
benefit plan that offers coverage for preventive care, emergency care,
inpatient and outpatient hospital care, pharmaceutical benefits, and
physician care but that is not required to include, in whole or in part,
state-mandated health benefits;

7 (2) "State-mandated health benefits", coverages for health care 8 services or benefits, required by this chapter, state law or state regulations, requiring the reimbursement or utilization related to a 9 10 specific illness, injury, or condition of the covered person, or inclusion of a specific category of licensed health care practitioner to be 11 provided to the covered person in a health benefits plan for a 12health-related condition of a covered person. Provided, that for the 13purposes of the options provided by this section, state-mandated health 1415benefits which may be excluded in whole or in part shall not include 16 any health care services or benefits which were mandated by federal 17law, and "state-mandated health benefits" shall not mean standard 18provisions or rights required to be present in a health benefit plan pursuant to state law or state regulations unrelated to a specific illness, 19 20injury, or condition of the insured.

do business within this state shall offer limited mandate health 2223insurance policies to persons who have had their employment 24terminated. In order to qualify for a limited mandate health insurance policy under the provisions of this section, the person shall have had 25health insurance coverage under a health benefit plan through an 26employer for a minimum period of ninety days immediately prior to his 27or her termination. Applicants shall elect coverage under a limited 28mandate health insurance policy within sixty days of his or her 2930 termination date. Such policy shall be offered to the person at similar rates and conditions as if the person had remained in the employer's 31 employ and had continued his or her health insurance coverage 3233 through the employer under a basic health benefit plan without the inclusion of any particular state-mandated health benefits. An 34employer shall not be liable for any portion of the premium associated 35with the limited mandate health insurance policy. A person may obtain 36 37coverage under a limited mandate health insurance policy for a maximum period of eighteen months. 38

39 3. In offering a limited mandate health insurance policy, the40 health carrier shall:

41 (1) Provide written notice to the proposed insured as required
42 in subsection 4 of this section;

43 (2) Provide a list of current state-mandated health benefits to the
44 proposed insured; and

(3) Provide written notice to the proposed insured that he or she
may be eligible for health insurance coverage under the provisions of
the federal Comprehensive Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act
(COBRA).

49 4. For limited health insurance policies, the written notice 50 required in subsection 3 of this section shall include in bold type 51 within or accompanying the written application for such policy the 52 following:

53 "You have the option to select a limited health insurance
54 policy which is not subject to all of the state-mandated
55 health benefits normally required in insurance policies,
56 contracts, or agreements in this state. You have been
57 provided a list of specific services and benefits mandated
58 to be covered under Missouri law. This limited mandate

59health insurance policy may provide a more affordable 60 health insurance policy for you. At the same time, it may provide you with fewer health benefits than those normally 61 imposed on health insurance policies in Missouri. If you 62 63 are considering this option, please consult with your insurance producer to learn the degree to which the 64 limited mandate health insurance policy does not provide 65benefits equal to those policies, contracts, or agreements 66 67 subject to state-mandated health benefits."
