AN ACT

To repeal section 160.530, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to teacher resource centers for school districts.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 160.530, RSMo, is repealed and three new sections 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 160.530, 168.475, and 168.478, 3 to read as follows:

160.530. 1. Beginning with fiscal year 1994 and for all fiscal years thereafter, in order to be eligible for state aid distributed pursuant to section $\mathbf{2}$ 163.031, RSMo, a school district shall allocate one percent of moneys received 3 pursuant to section 163.031, RSMo, exclusive of categorical add-ons, to the 4 professional development committee of the district as established in subdivision $\mathbf{5}$ (1) of subsection 4 of section 168.400, RSMo, or to the teacher resource 6 center in which the district is located. Of the moneys allocated to the 7 8 professional development committee in any fiscal year as specified by this 9 subsection, seventy-five percent of such funds shall be spent in the same fiscal year for purposes determined by the professional development committee after 10 11 consultation with the administrators of the school district and approved by the local board of education as meeting the objectives of a school improvement plan 1213of the district that has been developed by the local board. Moneys expended for staff training pursuant to any provisions of this act shall not be considered in 1415determining the requirements for school districts imposed by this subsection.

2. Beginning with fiscal year 1994 and for all fiscal years thereafter,
eighteen million dollars [of the moneys appropriated to the department of
elementary and secondary education otherwise distributed to the public schools

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of the state pursuant to the provisions of section 163.031, RSMo, exclusive of 1920categorical add-ons,] shall be distributed by the commissioner of education to address statewide areas of critical need for learning and development as 2122determined by rule and regulation of the state board of education with the advice 23of the commission established by section 160.510 and the advisory council 24provided by subsection 1 of section 168.015, RSMo. The moneys described in this subsection may be distributed by the commissioner of education to colleges, 2526universities, private associations, professional education associations, statewide 27associations organized for the benefit of members of boards of education, public elementary and secondary schools, teacher resource centers, and other 28associations and organizations that provide professional development 2930 opportunities for teachers, administrators, family literacy personnel and boards of education for the purpose of addressing statewide areas of critical need, 31provided that subdivisions (1), (2) [and], (3), and (4) of this subsection shall 32constitute priority uses for such moneys. "Statewide areas of critical need for 33learning and development" shall include: 34

(1) Funding the operation of state management teams in districts with
academically deficient schools and providing resources specified by the
management team as needed in such districts;

(2) Funding for grants to districts, upon application to the department of
elementary and secondary education, for resources identified as necessary by the
district, for those districts which are failing to achieve assessment standards;

41 (3) Funding for teacher resource centers as established in section
42 168.475;

43 (4) Funding for family literacy programs;

44 [(4)] (5) Ensuring that all children, especially children at risk, children 45 with special needs, and gifted students are successful in school;

46 [(5)] (6) Increasing parental involvement in the education of their 47 children;

48 [(6)] (7) Providing information which will assist public school 49 administrators and teachers in understanding the process of site-based decision 50 making;

51 [(7)] (8) Implementing recommended curriculum frameworks as outlined
52 in section 160.514;

53 [(8)] (9) Training in new assessment techniques for students;

54 [(9)] (10) Cooperating with law enforcement authorities to expand

55 successful antidrug programs for students;

56 [(10)] (11) Strengthening existing curricula of local school districts to 57 stress drug and alcohol prevention;

58 [(11)] (12) Implementing and promoting programs to combat gang 59 activity in urban areas of the state;

[(12)] (13) Establishing family schools, whereby such schools adopt
proven models of one-stop state services for children and families;

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[(13)] (14) Expanding adult literacy services; and

[(14)] (15) Training of members of boards of education in the areas
deemed important for the training of effective board members as determined by
the state board of education.

3. Beginning with fiscal year [1994] 2009 and for all fiscal years 66 thereafter, no less than two million dollars of the moneys appropriated to the 67 department of elementary and secondary education [otherwise distributed to the 68 public schools of the state pursuant to the provisions of section 163.031, RSMo, 69 exclusive of categorical add-ons,] shall be distributed in grant awards by the 70state board of education and the commissioner of education, by rule and 71regulation, [for the "Success Leads to Success" grant program, which is hereby 72created. The purpose of the success leads to success grant program shall be to 7374recognize, disseminate and exchange information about the best professional 75teaching practices and programs in the state that address student needs, and to 76encourage the staffs of schools with these practices and programs to develop 77 school-to-school networks to share these practices and programs] to the various 78teacher resource centers established under section 168.475, RSMo.

4. The department shall include a listing of all expenditures under this
section in the annual budget documentation presented to the governor and
general assembly.

168.475. 1. As used in this section, the following terms shall 2 mean:

3 (1) "Teacher resource center", any site operated by a school 4 district, a consortium of school districts, a board of education, or 5 cooperating boards of education which is specifically established under 6 this section to provide professional support services to teachers within 7 the state in order to:

8 (a) Assist teachers, diagnose learning needs, experiment with the 9 use of multiple instructional approaches, assess student outcomes,

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10 assess staff development needs and plans, and train other school11 personnel in effective pedagogical approaches;

12 (b) Provide demonstration and training sites where teachers are 13 trained, specifically in the use of computers as teaching aids; the 14 criteria for school acquisition and use of computer equipment and 15 software; and the evaluation of computer-related materials;

16 (c) Develop and produce curricula and curricular materials 17 designed to meet the educational needs of students being served 18 through application of educational research or new or improved 19 methods, practices, and techniques;

20 (d) Provide training to improve the skills of teachers in order to 21 enable such teachers to meet the special educational needs of the 22 pupils they serve, and to familiarize such teachers with developments 23 in curriculum formulation and educational research, including the 24 manner in which the research can be used to improve teaching skills;

(e) Provide a location where teachers may share resources, ideas,
methods, and approaches directly related to classroom instruction and
become familiar with current teaching materials and products for use
in their classrooms; and

(f) Retrain teachers and other educational personnel to become
better qualified to teach in subject areas necessary to prepare students
in the disciplines of mathematics, science, and computer technology;

32 (2) "Site", the location or locations where the curriculum 33 development and training activities of the teacher resource and 34 computer training center take place.

2. In order to provide the school districts and teachers of the 3536 state with an opportunity to develop systematic, ongoing in-service 37training programs, assure the dissemination and application of educational research developments to classroom instruction and 38develop new curricula and curricular materials specifically designed 39to meet the educational needs of the students served, the commissioner 40of education shall, within available state appropriations and subject to 41 the procedures established in this section and section 160.530, RSMo, 42provide funds to any school district, consortium of school districts, 43board of education, or cooperating boards of education in order to plan, 44establish, and operate teacher resource training centers. Any school 45district or board requesting such funds shall make application therefor 46

47 at such time, in such manner, and containing or accompanied by such
48 information as the commissioner may through this section or by
49 regulation require.

3. Each such application shall be reviewed by the department of elementary and secondary education, which shall in each instance recommend to the commissioner action, as appropriate, including specific reasons for any denial of funds under this section. Any school district, consortium of school districts, board of education, or cooperating boards of education whose original application is rejected may resubmit a revised application for further review.

4. Any school district, consortium of school districts, board of education, or cooperating boards of education having an application approved under this section may collaborate, consult, and contract with an "approved public institution" or "approved private institution" of higher education in this state, as such terms are defined in section 173.1102, RSMo, in order to carry out activities under or provide technical assistance in connection with such application.

64 5. Each teacher resource center shall be operated by a board, the 65majority of which shall be composed of elementary and secondary 66 school teachers representative of teachers served by the teacher 67resource center. Teacher members shall be designated by the teacher associations or teacher unions in proportion to the teacher membership 68 69 in each organization in the area served by such center. Such board 70shall also include individuals designated by the school board or boards of education served by such center. Such board shall also include at 71least one parent of an elementary or secondary school pupil and at 7273least one representative of a business or industry that uses, produces, 74or is involved with computer equipment and software.

6. The powers and duties of each teacher resource center board shall include policy formulation, the employment of staff or consultants, budget control, and expenditure of funds to accomplish the purposes of this section, recommendations for subcontracting to secure technical and other kinds of assistance, and any other appropriate managerial or supervisory activities not otherwise prohibited by state or local law or regulations of the commissioner.

82 7. Each teacher resource center shall provide data annually as
83 prescribed by the commissioner.

84 8. The department of elementary and secondary education may 85promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, RSMo, 86 87 that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the 88 provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 536.028, 89 RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable and if any 90 of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 9192 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of 93 rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 9428, 2008, shall be invalid and void. 95

168.478. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Teacher Resource Center Fund", which shall consist of money collected $\mathbf{2}$ under section 168.475. The state treasurer shall be the custodian of the 3 fund and the commissioner of education may approve disbursements 4 from the fund in accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, 56 RSMo. The department of elementary and secondary education shall administer the fund and shall ensure, upon appropriation, that money 7 8 in the fund shall be used solely for the administration of section 9 168.475. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080, RSMo, to the contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium 1011 shall not revert to the credit of the general revenue fund. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other 12funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such 1314 investments shall be credited to the fund.

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
