## AN ACT

To repeal sections 116.010 and 116.080, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to initiative and referendum petition circulators, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 116.010 and 116.080, RSMo, are repealed and three

- 2 new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 116.010, 116.075,
- 3 and 116.080, to read as follows:

116.010. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates[,]:

- 2 (1) "County" means any one of the several counties of this state or the city 3 of St. Louis:
- 4 (2) "Election authority" means a county clerk or board of election
- 5 commissioners, as established by section 115.015, RSMo;
- 6 (3) "General election" means the first Tuesday after the first Monday in
- 7 November in even-numbered years;
- 8 (4) "Official ballot title" means the summary statement and fiscal note
- 9 summary prepared for all statewide ballot measures in accordance with the
- 10 provisions of this chapter which shall be placed on the ballot and, when
- 11 applicable, shall be the petition title for initiative or referendum petitions;
- 12 (5) "Resident" means a person who does not claim resident
- 13 privileges in another state or country, and whose actual residence and
- 14 legal permanent home address are both in Missouri, and have been for
- 15 at least thirty days before registering with the secretary of state;
- 16 (6) "Statewide ballot measure" means a constitutional amendment
- 17 submitted by initiative petition, the general assembly or a constitutional

Signatures collected by any circulator who has not registered with the secretary of state pursuant to this chapter on or before 5:00 p.m. on the final day for filing petitions with the secretary of state shall not be counted.

- 17 3. The circulator information required in subsection 2 of this section shall
- 18 be submitted to the secretary of state's office with the following oath and

- 20 I HEREBY SWEAR OR AFFIRM UNDER PENALTY OF PERJURY THAT
- 21 ALL STATEMENTS MADE BY ME ARE TRUE AND CORRECT.
- 4. Each petition circulator shall subscribe and swear to the proper

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affidavit on each petition page such circulator submits before a notary public 23 24 commissioned in Missouri. When notarizing a circulator's signature, a notary public shall sign his or her official signature and affix his or her official seal to 25the affidavit only if the circulator personally appears before the notary and 26 subscribes and swears to the affidavit in his or her presence. 27

285. Any circulator who falsely swears to a circulator's affidavit knowing it to be false is guilty of a class A misdemeanor punishable, notwithstanding the provisions of section 560.021, RSMo, to the contrary, for a term of imprisonment 30 not to exceed one year in the county jail or a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars or both.
