AN ACT

To amend chapter 191, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to anatomic pathology services.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 191, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 191.890, to read as follows:

- 191.890. 1. For purposes of this section, the term "anatomic pathology services" means:
- 3 (1) "Histopathology" or "surgical pathology", the gross and 4 microscopic examination and histologic processing of organ tissue
- 5 performed by a physician or under the supervision of a physician;
- 6 (2) "Cytopathology", the microscopic examination of cells, from
- fluids, aspirates, washings, brushings, or smears, including the Pap test
- 8 examination performed by a physician or under the supervision of a
- 9 physician;
- 10 (3) "Hematology", the microscopic evaluation of bone marrow
- 11 aspirates and biopsies performed by a physician or under the
- 12 supervision of a licensed physician, and peripheral blood smears when
- 13 the attending or treating physician or technologist requests that a
- 14 blood smear be reviewed by a pathologist;
- 15 (4) Subcellular pathology and molecular pathology; and
- 16 (5) Blood-banking services performed by pathologists.
- 17 2. As used in this section, "health care benefit program" means

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18 any public or private plan or contract under which any medical benefit,

- 19 item, or service is provided to any individual.
- 3. As used this section, "referring laboratory" does not include a
- 21 laboratory of a physician's office or group practice that does not
- $22 \quad \textbf{perform the professional component of the anatomic pathology service}$
- 23 involved.
- 4. Except as provided under subsection 6 of this section, no
- 25 licensed health care professional in the state shall, directly or
- 26 indirectly, charge, bill, or otherwise solicit payment for anatomic
- 27 pathology services unless such services were rendered personally by
- 28 the licensed health care professional or under the licensed health care
- 29 professional's direct supervision in accordance with Section 353 of the
- 30 Public Health Service Act, 42 U.S.C. 263a.
- 5. No patient, insurer, third-party payor, hospital, public health
- 32 clinic, or nonprofit health clinic shall be required to reimburse any
- 33 licensed health care professional for charges or claims submitted in
- 34 violation of this section.
- 6. The provisions of this section do not prohibit the billing of
- 36 anatomic pathology services:
- 37 (1) To a referring laboratory, or by a referring laboratory, in
- 38 instances where a sample or samples must be sent to another specialist;
- 39 (2) By a hospital, public health clinic, or non-profit health clinic;
- 40 (3) To a referring physician, or by a referring physician, who has
- 41 provided written confirmation to the physician or laboratory providing
- 42 the anatomic pathology service that the patient is not covered under a
- 43 health care benefit program;
- 44 (4) By any governmental agency or their specified public or
- 45 private agent.
- 46 7. Any referring physician billing a patient not covered by a
- 47 health care benefit program for anatomic pathology services shall
- 48 disclose in the bill to the patient:
- 49 (1) The name and address of the physician or laboratory
- 50 providing the anatomic pathology service for the patient; and
- 51 (2) The net amount or amounts paid or to be paid to the
- 52 physician or laboratory for each anatomic pathology service provided
- 53 for the patient.
- 8. Any referring physician billing a patient not covered by a

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health care benefit program for anatomic pathology services shall not markup, or charge a commission, or make a profit on, or directly or indirectly increase, the amount subject to disclosure under subdivision (2) of subsection 7 of this section.

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- 9. The respective state licensing boards having jurisdiction over any health care professional who may request or provide anatomic pathology services may revoke, suspend, or deny renewal of the license of any health care professional who violates the provisions of this section.
 - 10. Nothing in this section shall be construed to:
- 65 (1) Prohibit a referring physician from sending a patient's 66 specimen to any laboratory providing anatomic pathology services;
 - (2) Mandate the billing of any patient not covered under a health care benefit program.
