AN ACT

To amend chapter 173, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to combat veterans.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 173, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 173.900, to read as follows:

173.900. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Missouri Returning Heroes' Education Act".

- 2. For the purpose of this section, the term "combat veteran" 4 shall mean a person who served in armed combat in the military after
- 5 September 11, 2001, and to whom the following criteria shall apply:
- 6 (1) The veteran was a Missouri resident when first entering the 7 military; and
- 8 (2) The veteran was discharged from military service under 9 honorable conditions.
- 3. All institutions of higher education that receive any state
- 11 funds whatsoever shall limit the amount of tuition such institutions
- 12 charge to combat veterans to fifty dollars per credit hour, as long as
- 13 the veteran achieves and maintains a cumulative grade point average
- 14 of at least two and one-half on a four point scale, or its equivalent. The
- 15 tuition limitation shall only be applicable if the combat veteran is
- 6 enrolled in a program leading to a certificate, or an associate or
- 17 baccalaureate degree. The period during which a combat veteran is
- 18 eligible for a tuition limitation under this section shall expire at the

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19 end of the ten-year period beginning on the date of such veteran's last
20 discharge from service.

- 4. The coordinating board for higher education shall ensure that all applicable institutions of higher education in this state comply with the provisions of this section and may promulgate rules for the efficient implementation of this section.
- 25 5. If a combat veteran is eligible to receive financial assistance under any other federal or state student aid program, public or private, 2627the full amount of such aid shall be reported to the board by the institution and the veteran. The tuition limitation under this section 28shall be provided after all other federal and state aid for which the 29veteran is eligible has been applied, and no combat veteran shall 30 receive more than the actual cost of attendance when the limitation is 31combined with other aid made available to such veteran. 32
- 6. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 33 34 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to 35 all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 36 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable 3738 and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to 39 chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, 40 41 then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2008, shall be invalid and void.
