STATE GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

TAX RELIEF FOR SENIORS

PROPERTY TAX CREDIT (Circuit Breaker)

This is a tax credit against property taxes paid. You do not have to file a federal or state tax return to be eligible. Households with a maximum income of \$30,000 for married couples and \$27,500 for single households can apply for the tax credit. There is a \$4,000 deduction for married couples who owned and lived in the property for the entire year. The maximum amount of the tax credit is \$1,100. Property taxes must be paid before filing a claim. An older adult who rents may claim a credit of up to 20% of the rent paid, even if they live in a nursing home. The maximum credit for renters is \$750.

HOMESTEAD PRESERVATION CREDIT

Individuals are eligible to receive a credit if their real estate property tax increases 2.5% in a non-reassessment year or 5% in a reassessment year. The credit would be for the amount of the increase. This credit is for people who file state and federal tax returns and is subject to the Legislature appropriating money.

HEALTH AND SENIOR SERVICES HOME & COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES

Ideally, we will live a long, healthy life in our home, but sometimes things don't work out the way we hope. When a person needs assistance there are options that will allow them to stay in their home and levels of care to choose from. The Division of Senior and Disability Services administers a coordinated, integrated home-and-community based service delivery system to assure that the needs are met.

Certified volunteer counselors assist people locally to help them work through health care issues and understand Medicare options or changes. CLAIM is not affiliated with any insurance company and sells nothing.


