STATE GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

TAX RELIEF FOR SENIORS

The Department of Revenue administers two real estate tax assistant programs, for you to choose from: the Missouri Property Tax Credit Claim (Circuit Breaker) and the Homestead Preservation Credit. See if you are eligible at www.dor.mo.gov/tax/personal or call 866-433-7259 or 573-751-3505

PROPERTY TAX CREDIT (Circuit Breaker)

This is a tax credit against property taxes paid. You do not have to file a federal or state tax return to be eligible. Households with a maximum income of \$30,000 for married couples and \$27,500 for single households can apply for the tax credit. There is a \$4,000 deduction for married couples who owned and lived in the property for the entire year. The maximum amount of the tax credit is \$1,100. Property taxes must be paid before filing a claim. An older adult who rents may claim a credit of up to 20% of the rent paid, even if they live in a nursing home. The maximum credit for renters is \$750.

HOMESTEAD PRESERVATION CREDIT

Individuals are eligible to receive a credit if their real estate property tax increases 2.5% in a non-reassessment year or 5% in a reassessment year. The credit would be for the amount of the increase. This credit is for people who file state and federal tax returns and is subject to the Legislature appropriating money.

HOME & COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES

The Division of Senior and Disability Services administers a coordinated, integrated home-and-community based service delivery system to assure that the needs are met.

AUDRAIN COUNTY

Audrain County was established in 1836. Some say the county was named for settler Samuel Audrain, while others say it was named after James H. Audrain, a member of the state legislature. Mexico, centrally located and the oldest town in Audrain, was designated the county seat. It was founded by two early settlers chose the town's name because of widespread excitement over Texas fighting for independence from the country of Mexico; it was the place to go to make your fortune and they were confident that the name would bring the new village good luck and "popularity." Audrain County has a total area of 697 square miles of which 693 square miles are land and 4 square miles are water. There are 25,892 people living in Audrain County according to the 2007 US Census Bureau estimates, which averages out to be about 37 people per square mile.

Kahoka, the county seat, was founded in 1857 and is named for the Cahokia tribe of the Illiniwek or Illinois Confederacy. Wyaconda was organized in 1888 and is named after a Siouan name for God or the Great Spirit Wyaconda is an awesome city with lots of great history. The first land purchased from the Santa Fe and Land Co. was in 1888. The county has a total area of 512 square miles of which 507 square miles are land and 5 square miles are water. There are 7,220 people living in Clark County according to the 2007 US Census Bureau estimates, which averages out to be about 14 ½ people per square mile.
