## Senator Wright-Jones Stresses Need to Focus on 21<sup>st</sup> Century Jobs in Recent Committee Meeting

JEFFERSON CITY – Sen. Robin Wright-Jones, D-St. Louis, recently attended the second meeting of the <u>Missouri Senate Educated Citizenry 2020 Committee</u>, held at the State Capitol on Tuesday, Aug. 25. A series of "2020" committees was created this past session to implement plans for improving major areas of development in Missouri.

The Educated Citizenry 2020 Committee (established under <u>Senate Resolution</u> <u>304</u>), among other charges, has been assigned to develop a long-term strategy for an education system in Missouri that provides children access to quality education.

During the meeting, members shared their goals for how they see the committee's long-term strategy laid out. Topics included how the committee was going to develop its vision for education in Missouri and how to create the principles and values that will guide lawmakers in that process.

"As a former classroom teacher, I know the importance of laying a strong foundation for students in our state — no matter where they are in their educational timeline," Sen. Wright-Jones said. "Technology continues to grow at an amazing rate and I believe we should focus on 21<sup>st</sup> Century jobs so Missouri graduates can compete with emerging careers."
