Sen. David Pearce Participates in 4-H Missouri Citizenship Youth Forum

JEFFERSON CITY— Senator David Pearce (R-Warrensburg) today took part in the 2009 Missouri Citizenship Youth Forum, which is organized through the state's 4-H program.

More than 150 young Missourians from across the state are attending the three-day event held in Jefferson City, which is designed to teach the students about state government.

"This is a great opportunity to give Missouri's future leaders some insight into the legislative process," Sen. Pearce said. "Many of these bright students will go on to become the state's public servants; it is important for them to understand early on where Missouri's laws come from and how they are created. I'm happy to be able to pass along the knowledge I've gained as a lawmaker to the next generation."

The Youth Forum is divided into four tracks focusing on the state's legislative, executive and judicial processes and media relations. Senator Pearce participated in a mock debate on the House floor to engage students involved in the legislative track.

"I love 4-H because of the many wonderful opportunities it provides our youth," Sen. Pearce said.

Senator Pearce has been closely involved in local 4-H programs for years. He is a former 10-year 4-H member and still volunteers as a Project Leader.
