AN ACT

To repeal sections 304.170 and 304.260, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to tractor parades, with an emergency clause.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 304.170 and 304.260, RSMo, are repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 304.170 and 304.260, to read as follows:

304.170. 1. No vehicle operated upon the highways of this state shall have a width, including load, in excess of one hundred two inches, except clearance lights, rearview mirrors or other accessories required by federal, state or city law or regulation. Provided however, a recreational vehicle as defined in section 700.010, RSMo, may exceed the foregoing width limits if the appurtenances on such recreational vehicle extend no further than the rearview mirrors. Such mirrors may only extend the distance necessary to provide the required field of view before the appurtenances were attached.

9 2. No vehicle operated upon the interstate highway system or upon any 10 route designated by the chief engineer of the state transportation department 11 shall have a height, including load, in excess of fourteen feet. On all other 12 highways, no vehicle shall have a height, including load, in excess of thirteen and 13 one-half feet, except that any vehicle or combination of vehicles transporting 14 automobiles or other motor vehicles may have a height, including load, of not 15 more than fourteen feet.

16 3. No single motor vehicle operated upon the highways of this state shall 17 have a length, including load, in excess of forty-five feet, except as otherwise **SCS SB 293**

18 provided in this section.

19 4. No bus, recreational motor vehicle or trackless trolley coach operated upon the highways of this state shall have a length in excess of forty-five feet, 2021except that such vehicles may exceed the forty-five feet length when such excess 22length is caused by the projection of a front safety bumper or a rear safety 23bumper or both. Such safety bumper shall not cause the length of the bus or recreational motor vehicle to exceed the forty-five feet length limit by more than 2425one foot in the front and one foot in the rear. The term "safety bumper" means 26any device which may be fitted on an existing bumper or which replaces the bumper and is so constructed, treated, or manufactured that it absorbs energy 2728upon impact.

295. No combination of truck-tractor and semitrailer or truck-tractor equipped with dromedary and semitrailer operated upon the highways of this 30 state shall have a length, including load, in excess of sixty feet; except that in 31order to comply with the provisions of Title 23 of the United States Code (Public 32Law 97-424), no combination of truck-tractor and semitrailer or truck-tractor 33equipped with dromedary and semitrailer operated upon the interstate highway 34system of this state shall have an overall length, including load, in excess of the 35length of the truck-tractor plus the semitrailer or truck-tractor equipped with 36 37dromedary and semitrailer. The length of such semitrailer shall not exceed 38fifty-three feet.

396. In order to comply with the provisions of Title 23 of the United States Code (Public Law 97-424), no combination of truck-tractor, semitrailer and trailer 40operated upon the interstate highway system of this state shall have an overall 41length, including load, in excess of the length of the truck-tractor plus the 42semitrailer and trailer, neither of which semitrailer or trailer shall exceed 43twenty-eight feet in length, except that any existing semitrailer or trailer up to 44 twenty-eight and one-half feet in length actually and lawfully operated on 45December 1, 1982, within a sixty-five foot overall length limit in any state, may 46 47continue to be operated upon the interstate highways of this state. On those primary highways not designated by the state highways and transportation 4849commission as provided in subsection 10 of this section, no combination of truck-tractor, semitrailer and trailer shall have an overall length, including load, 50in excess of sixty-five feet; provided, however, the state highways and 51transportation commission may designate additional routes for such sixty-five foot 52combinations. 53

547. Automobile transporters, boat transporters, truck-trailer boat transporter combinations, stinger-steered combination automobile transporters 55and stinger-steered combination boat transporters having a length not in excess 56 57of seventy-five feet may be operated on the interstate highways of this state and 58such other highways as may be designated by the highways and transportation 59commission for the operation of such vehicles plus a distance not to exceed ten 60 miles from such interstate or designated highway. All length provisions 61regarding automobile or boat transporters, truck-trailer boat transporter 62combinations and stinger-steered combinations shall include a semitrailer length not to exceed fifty-three feet and are exclusive of front and rear overhang, which 63 shall be no greater than a three-foot front overhang and no greater than a 64 65 four-foot rear overhang.

66 8. Driveaway saddlemount combinations having a length not in excess of ninety-seven feet may be operated on the interstate highways of this state and 67 such other highways as may be designated by the highways and transportation 68commission for the operation of such vehicles plus a distance not to exceed ten 69 70miles from such interstate or designated highway. Saddlemount combinations must comply with the safety requirements of Section 393.71 of Title 49 of the 71Code of Federal Regulations and may contain no more than three saddlemounted 7273vehicles and one fullmount.

749. No truck-tractor semitrailer-semitrailer combination vehicles operated upon the interstate and designated primary highway system of this state shall 7576have a semitrailer length in excess of twenty-eight feet or twenty-eight and 77one-half feet if the semitrailer was in actual and lawful operation in any state on December 1, 1982, operating in a truck-tractor semitrailer-semitrailer 78combination. The B-train assembly is excluded from the measurement of 7980 semitrailer length when used between the first and second semitrailer of a truck-tractor semitrailer-semitrailer combination, except that when there is no 81 semitrailer mounted to the B-train assembly, it shall be included in the length 8283 measurement of the semitrailer.

10. The highways and transportation commission is authorized to designate routes on the state highway system other than the interstate system over which those combinations of vehicles of the lengths specified in subsections 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 of this section may be operated. Combinations of vehicles operated under the provisions of subsections 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 of this section may be operated at a distance not to exceed ten miles from the interstate system and

90 such routes as designated under the provisions of this subsection.

9111. Except as provided in subsections 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 of this section, no other combination of vehicles operated upon the primary or interstate 9293highways of this state plus a distance of ten miles from a primary or interstate highway shall have an overall length, unladen or with load, in excess of sixty-five 9495feet or in excess of fifty-five feet on any other highway, except the state highways and transportation commission may designate additional routes for use by 96 sixty-five foot combinations, seventy-five foot stinger-steered combinations or 9798seventy-five foot saddlemount combinations. Any vehicle or combination of vehicles transporting automobiles, boats or other motor vehicles may carry a load 99 100which extends no more than three feet beyond the front and four feet beyond the rear of the transporting vehicle or combination of vehicles. 101

10212. (1) Except as hereinafter provided, these restrictions shall not apply 103to agricultural implements operating occasionally on the highways for short distances[,] including tractor parades for fund-raising activities or 104special events, provided the tractors are driven by licensed drivers 105106 during daylight hours only and with the approval of the superintendent of the Missouri state highway patrol; or to self-propelled hay-hauling 107 equipment or to implements of husbandry, or to the movement of farm products 108109 as defined in section [400.9-109] 400.9-102, RSMo, or to vehicles temporarily 110 transporting agricultural implements or implements of husbandry or roadmaking 111 machinery, or road materials or towing for repair purposes vehicles that have become disabled upon the highways; or to implement dealers delivering or moving 112farm machinery for repairs on any state highway other than the interstate 113114system.

(2) Implements of husbandry and vehicles transporting such machinery
or equipment and the movement of farm products as defined in section 400.9.109,
RSMo, may be operated occasionally for short distances on state highways when
operated between the hours of sunrise and sunset by a driver licensed as an
operator or chauffeur.

120 13. As used in this chapter the term "implements of husbandry" means 121 all self-propelled machinery operated at speeds of less than thirty miles per hour, 122 specifically designed for, or especially adapted to be capable of, incidental 123 over-the-road and primary offroad usage and used exclusively for the application 124 of commercial plant food materials or agricultural chemicals, and not specifically 125 designed or intended for transportation of such chemicals and materials. 126 14. Sludge disposal units may be operated on all state highways other 127 than the interstate system. Such units shall not exceed one hundred thirty-eight 128 inches in width and may be equipped with over-width tires. Such units shall 129 observe all axle weight limits. The chief engineer of the state transportation 130 department shall issue special permits for the movement of such disposal units 131 and may by such permits restrict the movements to specified routes, days and 132 hours.

304.260. Farm tractors when using the highways in traveling from one field or farm to another, or to or from places of delivery or repair, or when $\mathbf{2}$ 3 participating in activities or events permitted under subsection 12 of 4 section 304.170 are exempt from the provisions of the law relating to registration and display of number plates, but shall comply with all the other 5provisions hereof. The state highways and transportation commission shall have 6 7 the power and authority to prescribe the type of road upon which such tractors 8 may be used and may exclude the use of such tractors or the use of trucks of any 9 particular weight from the use of certain designated roads or types of roads, by 10the posting of signs along or upon such roads or any part thereof.

Section B. Because of the need to ensure safe interaction of tractors and other motor vehicles on Missouri highways, section A of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, peace and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of the constitution, and section A of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval.
