## AN ACT

To repeal sections 43.060, 306.227, and 590.030, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to educational requirements for certain law enforcement personnel.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 43.060, 306.227, and 590.030, RSMo, are repealed and 2 three new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 43.060, 3 306.227, and 590.030, to read as follows:

43.060. 1. Patrolmen and radio personnel shall not be less than twenty-one years of age. No person shall be appointed as superintendent or  $\mathbf{2}$ member of the patrol or as a member of the radio personnel who has been 3 4 convicted of a felony or any crime involving moral turpitude, or against whom any 5indictment or information may then be pending charging the person with having committed a crime, nor shall any person be appointed who is not of good 6 character or who is not a citizen of the United States and who at the time of 7 appointment is not a citizen of the state of Missouri; or who [is not a graduate of 8 an accredited four-year high school or in lieu thereof] has not completed a 9 high school program of education under chapter 167, RSMo, or who has 10 11 not obtained a General Educational Development (GED) certificate [of equivalency from the state department of elementary and secondary education or 12other source recognized by that department], and who has not obtained 13advanced education and experience as approved by the superintendent, 14or who does not possess ordinary physical strength, and who is not able to pass 1516the physical and mental examination that the superintendent prescribes.

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172. Except as provided in subsections 3 and 4 of this section, no member 18 of the patrol shall hold any other commission or office, elective or appointive, while a member of the patrol, except that the superintendent may authorize 19 20specified members to accept federal commissions providing investigative and arrest authority to enforce federal statutes while working with or at the direction 2122of a federal law enforcement agency. No member of the patrol shall accept any 23other employment, compensation, reward, or gift other than regular salary and 24expenses as herein provided except with the written permission of the 25superintendent. No member of the patrol shall perform any police duty connected with the conduct of any election, nor shall any member of the patrol at any time 2627or in any manner electioneer for or against any party ticket, or any candidate for nomination or election to office on any party ticket, nor for or against any 2829proposition of any kind or nature to be voted upon at any election.

30 3. Members of the patrol shall be permitted to be candidates for and 31 members or directors of the school board in any school district where they meet 32 the requirements for that position as set forth in chapter 162, RSMo. Members 33 of the patrol who become school board directors or members within the state shall 34 be permitted to receive benefits or compensation for their service to the school 35 board as provided by chapter 162, RSMo.

36 4. The superintendent may, by general order, set forth the circumstances
37 under which members of the patrol may, in addition to their duties as members
38 of the patrol, be engaged in secondary employment.

306.227. Patrolmen and radio personnel of the water patrol shall not be 2 less than twenty-one years of age. No person shall be appointed as commissioner 3 or as a member of the patrol or as a member of the radio personnel who:

4 (1) Has been convicted of a felony or any crime involving moral turpitude,
5 or against whom any indictment or information may then be pending charging the
6 person with having committed a crime;

- 7 (2) Is not of good character;
- 8 (3) Is not a citizen of the United States;

9 (4) At the time of appointment is not a citizen of the state of Missouri;

10 (5) [Is not a graduate of an accredited four-year high school or in lieu 11 thereof] Has not completed a high school program of education under 12 chapter 167, RSMo, or has not obtained a General Educational 13 Development (GED) certificate [of equivalency from the state department of 14 elementary and secondary education or other source recognized by such

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15 department], and who has not obtained advanced education and
16 experience as approved by the commissioner; or

17 (6) Does not possess ordinary physical strength, and who is not able to18 pass the physical and mental examination that the commissioner prescribes.

590.030. 1. The POST commission shall establish minimum standards for 2 the basic training of peace officers. Such standards may vary for each class of 3 license established pursuant to subsection 2 of section 590.020.

2. The director shall establish minimum age, citizenship, and general education requirements and may require a qualifying score on a certification examination as conditions of eligibility for a peace officer license. Such general education requirements shall require completion of a high school program of education under chapter 167, RSMo, or obtainment of a General Education Development (GED) certificate.

3. The director shall provide for the licensure, with or without additional
basic training, of peace officers possessing credentials by other states or
jurisdictions, including federal and military law enforcement officers.

4. The director shall establish a procedure for obtaining a peace officer
license and shall issue the proper license when the requirements of this chapter
have been met.

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5. As conditions of licensure, all licensed peace officers shall:

17 (1) Obtain continuing law enforcement education pursuant to rules to be18 promulgated by the POST commission; and

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(2) Maintain a current address of record on file with the director.

206. A peace officer license shall automatically expire if the licensee fails to hold a commission as a peace officer for a period of five consecutive years, 21provided that the POST commission shall provide for the relicensure of such 22persons and may require retraining as a condition of eligibility for relicensure, 23and provided that the director may provide for the continuing licensure, subject 24to restrictions, of persons who hold and exercise a law enforcement commission 25requiring a peace officer license but not meeting the definition of a peace officer 26pursuant to this chapter. 27

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
