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## AN ACT

To amend chapter 191, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the Alzheimer's state plan task force, with an expiration date.

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*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:*

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Section A. Chapter 191, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new  
2 section, to be known as section 191.115, to read as follows:

**191.115. 1. There is hereby established in the department of  
2 health and senior services an "Alzheimer's State Plan Task Force". The  
3 task force shall consist of eighteen members, as follows:**

4 **(1) The lieutenant governor or his or her designee;**

5 **(2) The directors of the departments of health and senior  
6 services, social services, and mental health or their designees;**

7 **(3) One member of the house of representatives appointed by the  
8 speaker of the house;**

9 **(4) One member of the senate appointed by the president pro tem  
10 of the senate;**

11 **(5) One member who has early stage Alzheimer's or a related  
12 dementia;**

13 **(6) One member who is a family caregiver of a person with  
14 Alzheimer's or a related dementia;**

15 **(7) One member who is a licensed physician with experience in  
16 the diagnosis, treatment, and research of Alzheimer's disease;**

17 **(8) One member from the office of the state ombudsman for long  
18 term care facility residents;**

19 **(9) One member representing the home care profession;**

20 **(10) One member representing residential long-term care;**

21 **(11) One member representing the adult day services profession;**

- 22           (12) One member representing the insurance profession;  
23           (13) One member representing the area agencies on aging;  
24           (14) One member who is a licensed elder law attorney;  
25           (15) Two members from the leading voluntary health  
26 organization in Alzheimer's care, support, and research.

27           2. The members of the task force, other than members from the  
28 general assembly and department directors, shall be appointed by the  
29 governor with the advice and consent of the senate. Members shall  
30 serve on the task force without compensation but may be reimbursed  
31 for their actual and necessary expenses from moneys appropriated to  
32 the department of health and senior services for that purpose. The  
33 department of health and senior services shall provide technical and  
34 administrative support services as required by the task force.

35           3. The task force shall:

36           (1) Assess the current and future impact of Alzheimer's disease  
37 and related dementia on residents of the state of Missouri;

38           (2) Examine the existing services and resources addressing the  
39 needs of persons with dementia, their families, and caregivers; and

40           (3) Develop recommendations to respond to the escalating public  
41 health situation regarding Alzheimer's.

42           4. The task force shall include an examination of the following  
43 in its assessment and recommendations required to be completed under  
44 subsection 3 of this section:

45           (1) Trends in state Alzheimer's and related dementia populations  
46 and their needs, including but not limited to, the state's role in long-  
47 term care, family caregiver support, and assistance to persons with  
48 early-stage Alzheimer's, early onset of Alzheimer's, and individuals with  
49 Alzheimer's and Down's Syndrome;

50           (2) Existing services, resources, and capacity, including but not  
51 limited to:

52           (a) Type, cost, and availability of services for persons with  
53 dementia, including home and community based resources, respite care  
54 to assist families, residential long-term care options, and adequacy and  
55 appropriateness of geriatric-psychiatric units for persons with behavior  
56 disorders associated with Alzheimer's and related dementia;

57           (b) Dementia-specific training requirements for individuals  
58 employed to provide care for persons with dementia;

59           (c) Quality care measure for services delivered across the  
60 continuum of care;

61           (d) Capacity of public safety and law enforcement to respond to  
62 persons with Alzheimer's and related dementia;

63           (e) State support for Alzheimer's research through institutes of  
64 higher learning in Missouri;

65           (3) Needed state policies or responses, including but not limited  
66 to directions for the provision of clear and coordinated services and  
67 supports to persons and families living with Alzheimer's and related  
68 dementias and strategies to address any identified gaps in services.

69           5. The task force shall hold a minimum of one meeting at four  
70 diverse geographic regions in the state of Missouri during the calendar  
71 year to seek public input.

72           6. The task force shall submit a report of its findings and date-  
73 specific recommendations to the general assembly and the governor in  
74 the form of a state Alzheimer's plan no later than November 1, 2010.

75           7. The task force shall continue to meet at the request of the  
76 chair and at a minimum of one time annually for the purpose of  
77 evaluating the implementation and impact of the task force  
78 recommendations and provide annual supplemental reports on the  
79 findings to the governor and the general assembly.

80           8. The provisions of this section shall expire on November 1,  
81 2012.

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
