AN ACT

To amend chapter 160, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the Missouri Strive to Succeed Graduation Program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 160, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 160.951, to read as follows:

160.951. 1. There is hereby established the "Missouri Strive to Succeed Graduation Program", which shall be implemented and administered by the department of elementary and secondary education.

- 2. The department of elementary and secondary education shall establish procedures by which school districts may apply for grant awards from the Missouri strive to succeed graduation program fund in order for such districts to implement student drop-out prevention strategies. The department may award grants for a period of one to five consecutive years. Upon expiration of the initial grant, the district may apply for an extension of the grant award for a period of time deemed appropriate by the district and the department.
- 3. The department shall give preference to school districts that propose to target students across the age spectrum, from pre-kindergarten through early adulthood and that employ the following characteristics:
- (1) A collaborative approach between the school district and various community organizations, which may include non-profit organizations, local governmental organizations, law enforcement agencies, approved public institutions and approved private institutions as such terms are defined in section 173.1102, RSMo, and

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- 22 institutions able to deliver proven, research-based intervention 23 services;
- 24 (2) Early intervention strategies, including family engagement,
- 25 early childhood education, early literacy development, family literacy,
- 26 and mental health detection and treatment;
- 27 (3) The implementation or augmentation of the following basic 28 core strategies for drop-out prevention:
- 29 (a) Mentoring;
- 30 (b) Tutoring;
- 31 (c) Alternative schooling;
- 32 (d) Career and technical education; and
- 33 (e) Before and after school programs;
- 34 (4) Increased accountability measures that track at-risk students 35 that leave the district; and
- 36 (5) The implementation of early intervention strategies for 37 students who display strong indicators that they will not graduate.
- 4. In order to be eligible for a grant under this program, a school district shall:
- 40 (1) Be classified as unaccredited, provisionally accredited, or 41 interim accredited by the state board of education;
- 42 (2) Have obtained a score on its most recent annual performance 43 review consistent with a classification of unaccredited or provisionally 44 accredited; or
- 45 (3) Have not met the graduation rate performance standard as 46 indicated on its most current annual performance review.
- 5. The department of elementary and secondary education shall promulgate rules necessary to implement this section, including:
- 49 (1) A procedure by which funds shall be allocated to school 50 districts to implement student drop-out prevention strategies; and
- 51 (2) Criteria to judge the effectiveness of participating school 52 districts' student drop-out prevention programs under the Missouri 53 strive to succeed graduation program.
- 54 Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010,
- 55 RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in this section
- 56 shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of
- 57 the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 536.028,
- 58 RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable and if any

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of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2009, shall be invalid and void.

- 64 6. The department of elementary and secondary education may cease grant payments to any school district at any time if the 65 department determines that funds are being misused or if the district's 66 student drop-out prevention program is determined to be 67 ineffective. The department of elementary and secondary education 68 shall provide written notice of a decision to discontinue payments of 69 funds to a school district at least thirty days prior to the cessation of 70 71such payments.
- 72 7. The department of elementary and secondary education shall 73 annually report the following information to the general assembly and 74 the governor, no later than January fifteenth:
- 75 (1) The recipients and amounts of the grants awarded under this rection; and
- 77 (2) Data on the graduation rate of each school district that 78 receives funding under this program from the preceding five years.
 - 8. The general assembly shall annually appropriate an amount sufficient to properly fund the provisions of this section, which shall be a minimum of five million dollars in any fiscal year.
- 82 9. There is hereby created in the state treasury "The Missouri 83 Strive to Succeed Graduation Program Fund", which shall consist of money collected under this section. The state treasurer shall be 84 85 custodian of the fund and may approve disbursements from the fund in accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, RSMo. Upon appropriation, 86 money in the fund shall be used solely for the administration of this 87 section. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080, RSMo, to the 88 contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium 89 shall not revert to the credit of the general revenue fund. The state 90 treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other 91 funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund. 93
 - 10. Pursuant to section 23.253, RSMo, of the Missouri Sunset Act:
 - (1) Any new program authorized under this section shall

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automatically sunset six years after the effective date of this section
unless reauthorized by an act of the general assembly; and

- (2) If such program is reauthorized, the program authorized under this section shall automatically sunset twelve years after the effective date of the reauthorization of this section; and
- 101 (3) This section shall terminate on September first of the 102 calendar year immediately following the calendar year in which a 103 program authorized under this section is sunset.

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
