AN ACT

To amend chapter 288, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to unemployment insurance during disasters, with an emergency clause and an expiration date.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 288, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 288.025, to read as follows:

288.025. 1. Insured workers who are eligible for benefits under this chapter shall not be required to serve the waiting week period as required in section 288.040 if the individual was, between January 26, 2009 and the expiration of this section, employed in or a resident of any county of the third classification without a township form of government and with more than thirty-four thousand but fewer than 7 thirty-four thousand one hundred inhabitants, any county of the third 8 classification without a township form of government and with more than twelve thousand but fewer than twelve thousand one hundred inhabitants, any county of the third classification without a township 10 form of government and with more than forty thousand eight hundred 11 but fewer than forty thousand nine hundred inhabitants, any county of 1213 the first classification with more than sixty-eight thousand six hundred 14 but fewer than sixty-eight thousand seven hundred inhabitants, any county of the third classification without a township form of 15 16 government and with more than five thousand nine hundred but fewer 17 than six thousand inhabitants, any county of the third classification without a township form of government and with more than thirteen 19 thousand seventy-five but fewer than thirteen thousand one hundred seventy-five inhabitants, any county of the third classification with a 20

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21township form of government and with more than thirty-three thousand 22one hundred but fewer than thirty-three thousand two hundred 23inhabitants, any county of the third classification without a township form of government and with more than thirty-seven thousand two 24hundred but fewer than thirty-seven thousand three hundred 25inhabitants, any county of the third classification without a township 26 form of government and with more than eleven thousand seven 27hundred fifty but fewer than eleven thousand eight hundred fifty 2829 inhabitants, any county of the third classification without a township form of government and with more than thirteen thousand four 30 hundred but fewer than thirteen thousand five hundred inhabitants, 31 any county of the second classification with more than nineteen 32thousand seven hundred but fewer than nineteen thousand eight 33 hundred inhabitants, any county of the third classification without a 34 35 township form of government and with more than ten thousand three hundred but fewer than ten thousand four hundred inhabitants, any 36 county of the third classification without a township form of 37 38 government and with more than nine thousand four hundred fifty but 39 fewer than nine thousand five hundred fifty inhabitants, any county of 40 the third classification without a township form of government and 41 with more than twenty thousand but fewer than twenty thousand one hundred inhabitants, any county of the third classification without a 4243 township form of government and with more than six thousand six hundred but fewer than six thousand seven hundred inhabitants, any 44 county of the third classification without a township form of 45 government and with more than thirteen thousand five hundred but 46 fewer than thirteen thousand six hundred inhabitants, any county of the third classification without a township form of government and 48 with more than forty thousand four hundred but fewer than forty 49 thousand five hundred inhabitants, any county of the third 50 classification without a township form of government and with more 51 than eight thousand three hundred but fewer than eight thousand four 52hundred inhabitants, any county of the third classification with a 53township form of government and with more than twenty-nine thousand seven hundred but fewer than twenty-nine thousand eight hundred 55 56 inhabitants, any county of the third classification without a township form of government and with more than twenty-eight thousand six 57

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hundred but fewer than twenty-eight thousand seven hundred inhabitants, any county of the first classification with more than thirty-nine thousand seven hundred but fewer than thirty-nine thousand eight hundred inhabitants, and any county of the third classification without a township form of government and with more than thirteen thousand two hundred but fewer than thirteen thousand three hundred inhabitants.

2. This section shall expire on April 1, 2009.

Section B. Because of the need to ensure that unemployed workers who work or reside in areas affected by the winter storm that occurred on January 26, 2009 immediately receive unemployment insurance benefits, section A of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, peace and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of the constitution, and section A of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval.



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
