AN ACT

To repeal section 301.010, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the regulation of certain off-highway vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 301.010, RSMo, is repealed and one 2 new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 3 301.010, to read as follows:

301.010. As used in this chapter and sections 304.0102 to 304.040, 304.120 to 304.260, RSMo, and sections 307.010 to 3 307.175, RSMo, the following terms mean:

4 (1) "All-terrain vehicle", any motorized vehicle 5 manufactured and used exclusively for off-highway use which 6 is fifty inches or less in width, with an unladen dry weight 7 of one thousand **five hundred** pounds or less, traveling on 8 three, four or more [low pressure] **nonhighway** tires, with a 9 seat designed to be straddled by the operator, or with a seat 10 designed to carry more than one person, and handlebars for 11 steering control;

12 (2) "Automobile transporter", any vehicle combination
13 designed and used specifically for the transport of assembled
14 motor vehicles;

15 (3) "Axle load", the total load transmitted to the road 16 by all wheels whose centers are included between two parallel 17 transverse vertical planes forty inches apart, extending 18 across the full width of the vehicle;

19 (4) "Boat transporter", any vehicle combination 20 designed and used specifically to transport assembled boats

21 and boat hulls; (5) "Body shop", a business that repairs physical 2223 damage on motor vehicles that are not owned by the shop or 24 its officers or employees by mending, straightening, replacing 25 body parts, or painting; "Bus", a motor vehicle primarily for 26(6) the 27 transportation of a driver and eight or more passengers but 28 not including shuttle buses; 29(7) "Commercial motor vehicle", a motor vehicle 30 designed or regularly used for carrying freight and 31 merchandise, or more than eight passengers but not including 32 vanpools or shuttle buses; 33 (8) "Cotton trailer", a trailer designed and used 34 exclusively for transporting cotton at speeds less than forty 35 miles per hour from field to field or from field to market 36 and return; "Dealer", any person, firm, corporation, 37(9) 38 association, agent or subagent engaged in the sale or 39 exchange of new, used or reconstructed motor vehicles or 40 trailers; (10) "Director" or "director of revenue", the director 41 42 of the department of revenue; 43(11) "Driveaway operation": The movement of a motor vehicle or trailer by any 44 (a) 45 person or motor carrier other than a dealer over any public 46 highway, under its own power singly, or in a fixed 47 combination of two or more vehicles, for the purpose of 48 delivery for sale or for delivery either before or after 49 sale; 50(b) The movement of any vehicle or vehicles, not owned 51 by the transporter, constituting the commodity being 52 transported, by a person engaged in the business of 53 furnishing drivers and operators for the purpose of 54 transporting vehicles in transit from one place to another by 55 the driveaway or towaway methods; or 56(c) The movement of a motor vehicle by any person who 57 is lawfully engaged in the business of transporting or 58 delivering vehicles that are not the person's own and 59 vehicles of a type otherwise required to be registered, by 60 the driveaway or towaway methods, from a point of 61 manufacture, assembly or distribution or from the owner of

62 the vehicles to a dealer or sales agent of a manufacturer or 63 to any consignee designated by the shipper or consignor;

64 (12) "Dromedary", a box, deck, or plate mounted behind 65 the cab and forward of the fifth wheel on the frame of the 66 power unit of a truck tractor-semitrailer combination. A 67 truck tractor equipped with a dromedary may carry part of a 68 load when operating independently or in a combination with a 69 semitrailer;

70 (13) "Farm tractor", a tractor used exclusively for 71 agricultural purposes;

72 (14) "Fleet", any group of ten or more motor vehicles 73 owned by the same owner;

74 (15) "Fleet vehicle", a motor vehicle which is included 75 as part of a fleet;

76 (16) "Fullmount", a vehicle mounted completely on the 77 frame of either the first or last vehicle in a saddlemount 78 combination;

79 (17) "Gross weight", the weight of vehicle and/or 80 vehicle combination without load, plus the weight of any load 81 thereon;

82"Hail-damaged vehicle", any vehicle, the body of (18)83 which has become dented as the result of the impact of hail; 84 (19)"Highway", any public thoroughfare for vehicles, 85 including state roads, county roads and public streets, 86 avenues, boulevards, parkways or alleys in any municipality; (20) "Improved highway", a highway which has been paved 87 88 with gravel, macadam, concrete, brick or asphalt, or surfaced 89 in such a manner that it shall have a hard, smooth surface; 90 (21)"Intersecting highway", any highway which joins

91 another, whether or not it crosses the same;

92 (22) "Junk vehicle", a vehicle which is incapable of 93 operation or use upon the highways and has no resale value 94 except as a source of parts or scrap, and shall not be titled 95 or registered;

96 (23) "Kit vehicle", a motor vehicle assembled by a 97 person other than a generally recognized manufacturer of 98 motor vehicles by the use of a glider kit or replica 99 purchased from an authorized manufacturer and accompanied by 100 a manufacturer's statement of origin;

101 (24) "Land improvement contractors' commercial motor 102 vehicle", any not-for-hire commercial motor vehicle the

103 operation of which is confined to:

104 (a) An area that extends not more than a radius of one 105 hundred miles from its home base of operations when 106 transporting its owner's machinery, equipment, or auxiliary 107 supplies to or from projects involving soil and water 108 conservation, or to and from equipment dealers' maintenance 109 facilities for maintenance purposes; or

(b) An area that extends not more than a radius of 111 fifty miles from its home base of operations when 112 transporting its owner's machinery, equipment, or auxiliary 113 supplies to or from projects not involving soil and water 114 conservation.

115 Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed to prevent any 116 motor vehicle from being registered as a commercial motor 117 vehicle or local commercial motor vehicle;

118 (25) "Local commercial motor vehicle", a commercial 119 motor vehicle whose operations are confined solely to a 120 municipality and that area extending not more than fifty 121 miles therefrom, or a commercial motor vehicle whose 122 property-carrying operations are confined solely to the 123 transportation of property owned by any person who is the 124 owner or operator of such vehicle to or from a farm owned by 125 such person or under the person's control by virtue of a 126 landlord and tenant lease; provided that any such property 127 transported to any such farm is for use in the operation of 128 such farm;

129(26)"Local log truck", a commercial motor vehicle 130 which is registered pursuant to this chapter to operate as a 131 motor vehicle on the public highways of this state, used 132 exclusively in this state, used to transport harvested forest 133 products, operated solely at a forested site and in an area 134 extending not more than a one hundred-mile radius from such 135 site, carries a load with dimensions not in excess of 136 twenty-five cubic yards per two axles with dual wheels, and 137 when operated on the national system of interstate and 138 defense highways described in Title 23, Section 103(e) of the 139 United States Code, such vehicle shall not exceed the weight 140 limits of section 304.180, RSMo, does not have more than four 141 axles, and does not pull a trailer which has more than two 142 axles. Harvesting equipment which is used specifically for 143 cutting, felling, trimming, delimbing, debarking, chipping,

144 skidding, loading, unloading, and stacking may be transported 145 on a local log truck. A local log truck may not exceed the 146 limits required by law, however, if the truck does exceed 147 such limits as determined by the inspecting officer, then 148 notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, 149 such truck shall be subject to the weight limits required by 150 such sections as licensed for eighty thousand pounds;

151"Local log truck tractor", a commercial motor (27)152 vehicle which is registered under this chapter to operate as 153a motor vehicle on the public highways of this state, used 154exclusively in this state, used to transport harvested forest products, operated solely at a forested site and in an area 155156extending not more than a one hundred-mile radius from such site, operates with a weight not exceeding twenty-two 157 $158\,$ thousand four hundred pounds on one axle or with a weight not 159 exceeding forty-four thousand eight hundred pounds on any 160 tandem axle, and when operated on the national system of 161interstate and defense highways described in Title 23, 162 Section 103(e) of the United States Code, such vehicle does 163 not exceed the weight limits contained in section 304.180, 164 RSMo, and does not have more than three axles and does not pull a trailer which has more than two axles. Violations of 165166axle weight limitations shall be subject to the load limit 167 penalty as described for in sections 304.180 to 304.220, 168 RSMo;

169 (28) "Local transit bus", a bus whose operations are 170 confined wholly within a municipal corporation, or wholly 171 within a municipal corporation and a commercial zone, as 172 defined in section 390.020, RSMo, adjacent thereto, forming 173 a part of a public transportation system within such 174 municipal corporation and such municipal corporation and 175 adjacent commercial zone;

176 (29) "Log truck", a vehicle which is not a local log 177 truck or local log truck tractor and is used exclusively to 178 transport harvested forest products to and from forested 179 sites which is registered pursuant to this chapter to operate 180 as a motor vehicle on the public highways of this state for 181 the transportation of harvested forest products;

182 (30) "Major component parts", the rear clip, cowl, 183 frame, body, cab, front-end assembly, and front clip, as 184 those terms are defined by the director of revenue pursuant

185 to rules and regulations or by illustrations; 186(31) "Manufacturer", any person, firm, corporation or 187 association engaged in the business of manufacturing or 188 assembling motor vehicles, trailers or vessels for sale; 189(32) "Mobile scrap processor", a business located in 190 Missouri or any other state that comes onto a salvage site 191 and crushes motor vehicles and parts for transportation to a 192 shredder or scrap metal operator for recycling; 193(33) "Motor change vehicle", a vehicle manufactured 194 prior to August, 1957, which receives a new, rebuilt or used 195 engine, and which used the number stamped on the original 196 engine as the vehicle identification number; 197 (34) "Motor vehicle", any self-propelled vehicle not 198 operated exclusively upon tracks, except farm tractors; (35) "Motor vehicle primarily for business use", any 199200 vehicle other than a recreational motor vehicle, motorcycle, 201 motortricycle, or any commercial motor vehicle licensed for 202 over twelve thousand pounds: 203(a) Offered for hire or lease; or 204(b) The owner of which also owns ten or more such 205 motor vehicles; 206 (36) "Motorcycle", a motor vehicle operated on two 207 wheels; 208"Motorized bicycle", any two-wheeled (37) or 209 three-wheeled device having an automatic transmission and a 210 motor with a cylinder capacity of not more than fifty cubic 211 centimeters, which produces less than three gross brake 212 horsepower, and is capable of propelling the device at a 213 maximum speed of not more than thirty miles per hour on level 214 ground; 215(38) "Motortricycle", a motor vehicle operated on three 216 wheels, including a motorcycle while operated with any 217 conveyance, temporary or otherwise, requiring the use of a 218 third wheel. A motortricycle shall not be included in the 219 definition of all-terrain vehicle; 220(39) "Municipality", any city, town or village, whether 221 incorporated or not; "Nonresident", a resident of a state or country 222(40) 223 other than the state of Missouri; 224(41) "Non-USA-std motor vehicle", a motor vehicle not 225 originally manufactured in compliance with United States

226 emissions or safety standards;

227 (42) "Operator", any person who operates or drives a 228 motor vehicle;

229(43) "Owner", any person, firm, corporation or 230association, who holds the legal title to a vehicle or in the 231event a vehicle is the subject of an agreement for the 232conditional sale or lease thereof with the right of purchase 233 upon performance of the conditions stated in the agreement 234 and with an immediate right of possession vested in the 235 conditional vendee or lessee, or in the event a mortgagor of 236 a vehicle is entitled to possession, then such conditional 237vendee or lessee or mortgagor shall be deemed the owner for 238the purpose of this law;

239 (44) "Public garage", a place of business where motor 240 vehicles are housed, stored, repaired, reconstructed or 241 repainted for persons other than the owners or operators of 242 such place of business;

243 (45) "Rebuilder", a business that repairs or rebuilds 244 motor vehicles owned by the rebuilder, but does not include 245 certificated common or contract carriers of persons or 246 property;

247 (46) "Reconstructed motor vehicle", a vehicle that is 248 altered from its original construction by the addition or 249 substitution of two or more new or used major component 250 parts, excluding motor vehicles made from all new parts, and 251 new multistage manufactured vehicles;

252 (47) "Recreational off-highway vehicle", any motorized 253 vehicle manufactured and used exclusively for off-highway use 254 which is sixty inches or less in width, with an unladen dry 255 weight of one thousand five hundred pounds or less, traveling 256 on four or more nonhighway tires, with a nonstraddle seat, 257 and steering wheel, which are subject to the same 258 registration requirements and trail use as all-terrain 259 vehicles;

260 (48) "Recreational motor vehicle", any motor vehicle 261 designed, constructed or substantially modified so that it 262 may be used and is used for the purposes of temporary housing 263 quarters, including therein sleeping and eating facilities 264 which are either permanently attached to the motor vehicle or 265 attached to a unit which is securely attached to the motor

266 vehicle. Nothing herein shall prevent any motor vehicle from 267 being registered as a commercial motor vehicle if the motor 268 vehicle could otherwise be so registered;

269 [(48)] (49) "Rollback or car carrier", any vehicle 270 specifically designed to transport wrecked, disabled or 271 otherwise inoperable vehicles, when the transportation is 272 directly connected to a wrecker or towing service;

[(49)] (50) "Saddlemount combination", a combination of vehicles in which a truck or truck tractor tows one or more trucks or truck tractors, each connected by a saddle to the frame or fifth wheel of the vehicle in front of it. The "saddle" is a mechanism that connects the front axle of the to wed vehicle to the frame or fifth wheel of the vehicle in front and functions like a fifth wheel kingpin connection. When two vehicles are towed in this manner the combination is called a "double saddlemount combination". When three wehicles are towed in this manner, the combination is called a "triple saddlemount combination";

284 [(50)] (51) "Salvage dealer and dismantler", a 285 business that dismantles used motor vehicles for the sale of 286 the parts thereof, and buys and sells used motor vehicle 287 parts and accessories;

288 [(51)] (52) "Salvage vehicle", a motor vehicle, 289 semitrailer, or house trailer which:

(a) Was damaged during a year that is no more than six years after the manufacturer's model year designation for such vehicle to the extent that the total cost of repairs to rebuild or reconstruct the vehicle to its condition immediately before it was damaged for legal operation on the roads or highways exceeds eighty percent of the fair market value of the vehicle immediately preceding the time it was damaged;

(b) By reason of condition or circumstance, has been declared salvage, either by its owner, or by a person, firm, or other legal entity exercising the right of security interest in it;

302 (c) Has been declared salvage by an insurance company 303 as a result of settlement of a claim;

304 (d) Ownership of which is evidenced by a salvage title; 305 or

(e) Is abandoned property which is titled pursuant to section 304.155, RSMo, or section 304.157, RSMo, and designated with the words "salvage/abandoned property".
309 The total cost of repairs to rebuild or reconstruct the 310 vehicle shall not include the cost of repairing, replacing, 311 or reinstalling inflatable safety restraints, tires, sound 312 systems, or damage as a result of hail, or any sales tax on 313 parts or materials to rebuild or reconstruct the vehicle.
314 For purposes of this definition, "fair market value" means 315 the retail value of a motor vehicle as:

316 a. Set forth in a current edition of any nationally 317 recognized compilation of retail values, including automated 318 databases, or from publications commonly used by the 319 automotive and insurance industries to establish the values 320 of motor vehicles;

321 b. Determined pursuant to a market survey of comparable 322 vehicles with regard to condition and equipment; and

323 c. Determined by an insurance company using any other 324 procedure recognized by the insurance industry, including 325 market surveys, that is applied by the company in a uniform 326 manner;

327 [(52)] (53) "School bus", any motor vehicle used 328 solely to transport students to or from school or to 329 transport students to or from any place for educational 330 purposes;

331 [(53)] (54) "Shuttle bus", a motor vehicle used or 332 maintained by any person, firm, or corporation as an 333 incidental service to transport patrons or customers of the 334 regular business of such person, firm, or corporation to and 335 from the place of business of the person, firm, or 336 corporation providing the service at no fee or charge. 337 Shuttle buses shall not be registered as buses or as 338 commercial motor vehicles;

339 [(54)] (55) "Special mobile equipment", every 340 self-propelled vehicle not designed or used primarily for the 341 transportation of persons or property and incidentally 342 operated or moved over the highways, including farm 343 equipment, implements of husbandry, road construction or 344 maintenance machinery, ditch-digging apparatus, stone 345 crushers, air compressors, power shovels, cranes, graders,

346 rollers, well-drillers and wood-sawing equipment used for 347 hire, asphalt spreaders, bituminous mixers, bucket loaders, 348 ditchers, leveling graders, finished machines, motor graders, 349 road rollers, scarifiers, earth-moving carryalls, scrapers, 350 drag lines, concrete pump trucks, rock-drilling and 351 earth-moving equipment. This enumeration shall be deemed 352 partial and shall not operate to exclude other such vehicles 353 which are within the general terms of this section;

354 [(55)] (56) "Specially constructed motor vehicle", a 355 motor vehicle which shall not have been originally 356 constructed under a distinctive name, make, model or type by 357 a manufacturer of motor vehicles. The term specially 358 constructed motor vehicle includes kit vehicles;

359 [(56)] (57) "Stinger-steered combination", a truck 360 tractor-semitrailer wherein the fifth wheel is located on a 361 drop frame located behind and below the rearmost axle of the 362 power unit;

363 [(57)] (58) "Tandem axle", a group of two or more 364 axles, arranged one behind another, the distance between the 365 extremes of which is more than forty inches and not more than 366 ninety-six inches apart;

367 [(58)] (59) "Tractor", "truck tractor" or 368 "truck-tractor", a self-propelled motor vehicle designed for 369 drawing other vehicles, but not for the carriage of any load 370 when operating independently. When attached to a 371 semitrailer, it supports a part of the weight thereof;

[(59)] (60) "Trailer", any vehicle without motive power designed for carrying property or passengers on its own structure and for being drawn by a self-propelled vehicle, except those running exclusively on tracks, including a semitrailer or vehicle of the trailer type so designed and used in conjunction with a self-propelled vehicle that a considerable part of its own weight rests upon and is carried by the towing vehicle. The term "trailer" shall not include cotton trailers as defined in subdivision (8) of this section and shall not include manufactured homes as defined in section 700.010, RSMo;

383 [(60)] (61) "Truck", a motor vehicle designed, used, 384 or maintained for the transportation of property;

385 [(61)] (62) "Truck-tractor semitrailer-semitrailer",

386 a combination vehicle in which the two trailing units are 387 connected with a B-train assembly which is a rigid frame 388 extension attached to the rear frame of a first semitrailer 389 which allows for a fifth-wheel connection point for the 390 second semitrailer and has one less articulation point than 391 the conventional A-dolly connected truck-tractor 392 semitrailer-trailer combination;

393 boat transporter **[**(62)**]** (63) "Truck-trailer 394combination", a boat transporter combination consisting of a straight truck towing a trailer using typically a ball and 395396 socket connection with the trailer axle located substantially 397at the trailer center of gravity rather than the rear of the 398 trailer but so as to maintain a downward force on the trailer 399 tonque;

400 [(63)] (64) "Used parts dealer", a business that buys 401 and sells used motor vehicle parts or accessories, but not 402 including a business that sells only new, remanufactured or 403 rebuilt parts. "Business" does not include isolated sales at 404 a swap meet of less than three days;

405 [(64)] (65) "Utility vehicle", any motorized vehicle 406 manufactured and used exclusively for off-highway use which 407 is sixty-three inches or less in width, with an unladen dry 408 weight of one thousand eight hundred fifty pounds or less, 409 traveling on four or six wheels, to be used primarily for 410 landscaping, lawn care, or maintenance purposes;

(66) "Vanpool", any van or other motor vehicle 411 [(65)] used or maintained by any person, group, firm, corporation, 412association, city, county or state agency, or any member 413thereof, for the transportation of not less than eight nor 414 415more than forty-eight employees, per motor vehicle, to and from their place of employment; however, a vanpool shall not 416 417be included in the definition of the term bus or commercial motor vehicle as defined by subdivisions (6) and (7) of this 418419section, nor shall a vanpool driver be deemed a chauffeur as that term is defined by section 302.010, RSMo; nor shall use 420 421of vanpool vehicle for ride-sharing arrangements, а 422recreational, personal, or maintenance uses constitute an 423 unlicensed use of the motor vehicle, unless used for monetary 424 profit other than for use in a ride-sharing arrangement; 425[(66)] (67) "Vehicle", any mechanical device on

426 wheels, designed primarily for use, or used, on highways, 427 except motorized bicycles, vehicles propelled or drawn by 428 horses or human power, or vehicles used exclusively on fixed 429 rails or tracks, or cotton trailers or motorized wheelchairs 430 operated by handicapped persons;

431 [(67)] (68) "Wrecker" or "tow truck", any emergency 432 commercial vehicle equipped, designed and used to assist or 433 render aid and transport or tow disabled or wrecked vehicles 434 from a highway, road, street or highway rights-of-way to a 435 point of storage or repair, including towing a replacement 436 vehicle to replace a disabled or wrecked vehicle;

437 [(68)] (69) "Wrecker or towing service", the act of 438 transporting, towing or recovering with a wrecker, tow truck, 439 rollback or car carrier any vehicle not owned by the operator 440 of the wrecker, tow truck, rollback or car carrier for which 441 the operator directly or indirectly receives compensation or 442 other personal gain.
