AN ACT

To amend chapter 58, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to testing for psychotropic substances in suicide cases.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 58, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 58.444, to read as follows:

58.444. 1. If any person within a coroner's or medical examiner's jurisdiction dies as a result of suicide, the coroner or medical examiner shall report the death and circumstances of the suicide to the department of health and senior services in writing. The description of the circumstances of the suicide shall include any information provided by law enforcement regarding any violent acts alleged to have been committed by the person immediately prior to his or her death. Such report shall be made within five days of the conclusion of the tests required in subsection 2 of this section.

2. The coroner or medical examiner shall perform, or cause to be 10 performed, such tests, including tissue testing, as are necessary to 11 determine the presence of psychotropic substances in the body of the 12deceased. For the purposes of this section, the term "psychotropic 1314 substances" shall mean antidepressants, antipsychotics, stimulants, or 15amphetamines. The results of such tests shall be included in the 16 coroner's or medical examiner's report to the department. The contents 17of the report, including any test results, shall be used by the 18department for statistical purposes only and the department shall not reveal the identity of the deceased. 19

20 3. The department shall provide an annual report to the 21 governor compiling the information received from coroners and 22 medical examiners throughout the state. It shall include the number 23 of suicides involving psychotropic substances, and specifically, the 24 number of such suicides that also involved violent acts committed by 25 the deceased immediately prior to death. The department shall also 26 make such report available to the public and forward it to the United 27 States Food and Drug Administration.

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
