Fourth District Resident Appointed to Serve on State Board

JEFFERSON CITY – State Sen. Joe Keaveny, D-St. Louis, would like to congratulate 4th District resident Pamela Marshall for her recent re-appointment to serve on the State Board of Pharmacy. Seven members sit on the panel with terms totaling five years in length. Marshall’s new term will end Sept. 24, 2015.

The board is mandated by law to issue renewal and original licenses to pharmacists, pharmacies, drug distributors, intern pharmacists, and pharmacy technicians. The board is also responsible, among other charges, for assuring safe, competent pharmacy services for the citizens of this state.

“Marshall’s vast experience in the pharmacy field, in addition to her previous time on the board, will help the panel continue to serve Missourians by providing an accessible, responsible, and accountable pharmacy system in our state,” said Sen. Keaveny. “With this re-appointment, I know she will continue to use her many years of knowledge to best represent our citizens’ pharmacy needs.”

Currently, Marshall — a St. Louis resident — teaches at the St. Louis College of Pharmacy and Southern Illinois University. Since 1990, she has worked for Walgreens Pharmacy, first as a manager and now as the pharmacy supervisor for more than 24 stores.
