Senator John Griesheimer Bids Final Farewell to the Missouri General Assembly

JEFFERSON CITY – Senator John Griesheimer (R-Washington) wrapped up his legislative career after the conclusion of the General Assembly's annual veto session on Sept. 15, 2010. This session marked Sen. Griesheimer's 18th year in the Legislature.

"I would like to thank the residents of the 26th District for allowing me to be their voice in Jefferson City over the last eight years in the Missouri Senate," said Sen. Griesheimer. "This is an opportunity not many individuals get to experience in their lifetime, and I am truly appreciative to the individuals who sent me here to represent their needs in the General Assembly."

Senator Griesheimer was elected to the Missouri House of Representatives in 1992. He then won the 26th Senatorial District seat in 2002. Due to term limits, Sen. Griesheimer, along with nine of his Senate colleagues, is ineligible to run for another legislative term. Lawmakers are limited to eight years in the Senate (two four-year terms) and eight years in the House (four two-year terms).

"It has been a great honor to work with such bright and talented individuals in this building, many who have become dear friends over the years," said Sen. Griesheimer. "I will miss working in the magnificent building known as our State Capitol, serving side-by-side with my legislative colleagues, and making a difference in the lives of citizens across our state."
