JEFFERSON CITY—Senator David Pearce (R-Warrensburg) has three interns in his Jefferson City office for the spring legislative session to assist his staff with various legislative, communications and administrative assignments.

Shay is a Political Science major and Business Administration minor. He will be graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree in May 2010 from UCM. After he graduates, he plans on furthering his education and pursing a higher degree.

She is a graduate student at the Truman School of Public Affairs at the University of Missouri in Columbia.
