AN ACT

To repeal section 640.240, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the minority and underrepresented environmental literacy program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 640.240, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 173.240, to read as follows: $\mathbf{2}$

173.240. 1. There is hereby established within the department of higher education a "Minority and Underrepresented Environmental 2 Literacy Program". The department of higher education, hereafter 3 4 referred to as the department, may award scholarships to minority and underrepresented students to pursue environmentally related courses $\mathbf{5}$ of study. The scholarships shall be administered by the department 6 7 recruitment and retention program under the supervision of the minority environmental literacy advisory committee established under 8 this section. Those ethnic groups which are most severely 9 underrepresented, as determined by data gathered and maintained by 10 the National Academy of Sciences, shall receive priority in annual 11 selection. 12

132. For the purpose of increasing the number of minority and 14 underrepresented students, as determined by the National Academy of 15Sciences, who are enrolled in environmentally related courses of study, 16there is hereby created a "Recruitment and Retention Scholarship 17Fund". Any unexpended balance in the recruitment and retention scholarship fund shall not be subject to biennial transfer under the 18

19 provisions of section 33.080. All interest earned on funds in the 20 recruitment and retention scholarship fund shall accrue to the fund.

3. The general assembly may appropriate funds to the department for the purpose of funding scholarships as authorized by this section. Such funds shall be from general revenue, special fees administered by the department, federal funding sources, gifts, or donations, provided that such funds may be used for this purpose. All sums received for this purpose shall be placed in the state treasury and credited to the recruitment and retention scholarship fund.

4. The department shall accept, receive and administer grants or other funds, gifts, or donations from the public and individuals, including the federal government, for the purpose of funding scholarships under this section. Such funds shall be deposited in the recruitment and retention scholarship fund.

33 5. The department shall promulgate rules to administer the scholarship program, which shall include qualifications, application 34forms, annual filing deadlines, and scholarship amounts. Any rule or 3536portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010 that is 37created under the authority delegated in this section shall become 38effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions 39of chapter 536, and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the 40 41 general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, to review, to delay the 42effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule 43proposed or adopted after August 28, 2010, shall be invalid and void. 44

6. The scholarship program shall be directed toward students in
the following areas of study:

47 (1) Engineering students pursuing an environmental course of
48 study through undergraduate and graduate degrees in civil, chemical,
49 mechanical, environmental, or biological engineering;

50 (2) Environmental sciences students pursuing undergraduate and
 51 graduate degrees in geology, biology, wildlife management, planning,
 52 natural resources, or a closely related course of study;

53 (3) Chemistry students pursuing undergraduate and graduate
 54 degrees in the field of environmental chemistry; and

55 (4) Law enforcement students pursuing undergraduate and

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56 graduate degrees in environmental law enforcement.

57 7. There is hereby created a "Minority Environmental Literacy 58 Advisory Committee", hereafter referred to as the committee, to be 59 comprised of:

60 (1) The commissioner of higher education or the commissioner's
61 designee, who will serve as chairperson of the committee;

62 (2) Three representatives of universities and colleges. The 63 universities and colleges shall be selected by the department, with the 64 approval of the director of the department of natural resources. The 65 university and college representatives shall each be appointed by the 66 affirmative action office of the respective institution;

67 (3) The director of the department of natural resources or the68 director's designee;

(4) Five at-large members appointed by the governor, with the
advice and consent of the senate, who shall be high school teachers and
college professors and who shall be selected to represent the various
regions of the state;

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(5) The state affirmative action officer.

8. The committee shall meet at least annually, at a time and place to be determined by the chairperson, to select students to receive scholarships from applications filed with the department retention and recruitment program. The members appointed by the governor shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses.

9. Colleges and universities described in this section shall
include public community colleges.

[640.240. 1. There is hereby established within the division $\mathbf{2}$ of environmental quality a "Minority and Underrepresented 3 Environmental Literacy Program". The department of natural resources, hereafter referred to as the department, may award 4 scholarships to minority and underrepresented students to pursue 5environmentally related courses of study. The scholarships shall 6 7 be administered by the division of environmental quality recruitment and retention program under the supervision of the 8 minority environmental literacy advisory committee established 9 under this section. Those ethnic groups which are most severely 10 11 underrepresented, as determined by data gathered and maintained 12by the National Academy of Sciences, shall receive priority in

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13 annual selection.

142. For the purpose of increasing the number of minority and underrepresented students, as determined by the National 1516 Academy of Sciences, who are enrolled in environmentally related courses of study, there is hereby created a "Recruitment and 1718 Retention Scholarship Fund". Any unexpended balance in the 19recruitment and retention scholarship fund shall not be subject to biennial transfer pursuant to the provisions of section 33.080, 2021RSMo. All interest earned on funds in the recruitment and 22retention scholarship fund shall accrue to the fund.

233. The general assembly may appropriate funds to the 24department for the purpose of funding scholarships as authorized 25by this section. Such funds shall be from general revenue, special 26fees administered by the department, federal funding sources, gifts or donations, provided that such funds may be used for this 2728purpose. All sums received for this purpose shall be placed in the 29state treasury and credited to the recruitment and retention 30 scholarship fund.
