AN ACT

To amend chapter 208, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to substance abuse of applicants and recipients of temporary assistance for needy families benefits.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 208, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 208.027, to read as follows:

208.027. 1. The department of social services shall develop a program to screen and test each work-eligible applicant or workeligible recipient who is otherwise eligible for temporary assistance for needy families benefits under this chapter and who the department has reasonable cause to believe engages in illegal use of controlled substances. Any applicant or recipient who is found to have tested positive for the use of a controlled substance, which was not prescribed for such applicant or recipient by a licensed health care provider, shall, after an administrative hearing conducted by the department under the provisions of chapter 536, be declared ineligible for temporary 10 assistance for needy families benefits for a period of two years from the 11 date of the administrative hearing decision unless such individual, 1213 after having been referred by the department, enters and successfully 14 completes a substance abuse treatment program administered by the division of alcohol and drug abuse within the department of mental 15 16 health and does not test positive for illegal use of a controlled substance in the six-month period beginning on the date the individual 17enters such rehabilitation or treatment program. The individual shall continue to receive benefits while participating in the treatment program. The department may test the individual for illegal drug use 20

21 at random or set intervals, at the department's discretion, after such 22 period.

- 2. Other members of a household, which includes a person who has been declared ineligible for temporary assistance for needy families assistance shall, if otherwise eligible, continue to receive temporary assistance for needy families benefits as protective or vendor payments to a third-party payee for the benefit of the members of the household.
- 3. The department of social services shall promulgate rules to develop the screening and testing provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010 that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2010, shall be invalid and void.

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
