## AN ACT

To repeal section 173.250, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the higher education academic scholarship program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 173.250, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 173.250, to read as follows:

173.250. 1. There is hereby established a "Higher Education Academic Scholarship Program" and any moneys appropriated by the general assembly for this program shall be used to provide scholarships for Missouri citizens to attend a Missouri college or university of their choice pursuant to the provisions of this section.

6 2. The definitions of terms set forth in section [173.205] **173.1102** shall 7 be applicable to such terms as used in this section. The term "academic 8 scholarship" means an amount of money paid by the state of Missouri to a 9 qualified college or university student who has demonstrated superior academic 10 achievement pursuant to the provisions of this section.

3. The coordinating board for higher education shall be the administrative
agency for the implementation of the program established by this section, and
shall:

(1) Promulgate reasonable rules and regulations for the exercise of its
functions and the effectuation of the purposes of this section, including
regulations for granting scholarship deferments;

17 (2) Prescribe the form and the time and method of awarding academic18 scholarships, and shall supervise the processing thereof; and

19 (3) Select qualified recipients to receive academic scholarships, make such

20 awards of academic scholarships to qualified recipients and determine the 21 manner and method of payment to the recipient.

4. A student shall be eligible for initial or renewed academic scholarship if he or she is in compliance with the eligibility requirements set forth in section [173.215] **173.1104** excluding the requirement of financial need and undergraduate status, and in addition meets the following requirements:

(1) Initial academic scholarships shall be offered in the academic year
immediately following graduation from high school to Missouri high school seniors
whose composite scores on the American College Testing Program (ACT) or the
Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) of the College Board are in the top five percent of
all Missouri students taking those tests during the school year in which the
scholarship recipients graduate from high school. In the freshman year of college,
scholarship recipients are required to maintain status as a full-time student;

33 (2) Academic scholarships are renewable if the recipient remains in
34 compliance with the applicable provisions of section [173.215] 173.1104 and the
35 recipient makes satisfactory academic degree progress as a full-time student.

36 5. A student who is enrolled or has been accepted for enrollment as a postsecondary student at an approved private or public institution beginning with 37the fall 1987, term and who meets the other eligibility requirements for an 3839academic scholarship shall, within the limits of the funds appropriated and made 40available, be offered an academic scholarship in the amount of two thousand dollars for each eligible student whose composite scores on the American College 41 42Testing Program (ACT) or the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) of the College Board are in the top three percent of all Missouri students taking those tests 43during the school year in which the scholarship recipients graduate from high 44school for each fiscal year prior to fiscal year 2011, and, subject to appropriations, 45three thousand dollars for fiscal year 2011 and every fiscal year thereafter, and 46one thousand dollars for fiscal year 2011 and every fiscal year thereafter for each 47eligible student whose composite scores on the American College Testing Program 4849(ACT) or the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) of the College Board are between the 50top five and three percent of all Missouri students taking those tests during the 51school year in which the scholarship recipients graduate from high school, for the first academic year of study, which scholarship shall be renewable in the amount 5253of two thousand dollars for each eligible student whose composite scores on the American College Testing Program (ACT) or the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) 54of the College Board are in the top three percent of all Missouri students taking 55

those tests during the school year in which the scholarship recipients graduate 5657from high school for each fiscal year prior to fiscal year 2011, and, subject to appropriations, three thousand dollars for fiscal year 2011 and every fiscal year 5859thereafter, and one thousand dollars for fiscal year 2011 and every fiscal year thereafter for each eligible student whose composite scores on the American 60 61 College Testing Program (ACT) or the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) of the 62College Board are between the top five and three percent of all Missouri students 63 taking those tests during the school year in which the scholarship recipients 64graduate from high school, annually for the second, third and fourth academic years or as long as the recipient is in compliance with the applicable eligibility 65requirements set forth in section [173.215] 173.1104, provided those years of 66 study are continuous and the student continues to meet eligibility requirements 67 for the scholarship; provided, however, if a recipient ceases all attendance at an 6869 approved public or private institution for the purpose of providing service to a 70nonprofit organization, a state or federal government agency or any branch of the armed forces of the United States, the recipient shall be eligible for a renewal 7172scholarship upon return to any approved public or private institution, provided the recipient: 73

(1) For a student who provides service to a nonprofit
organization or a state or federal government agency, returns to full-time
status within twenty-seven months;

(2) For a student who provides service to a branch of the armed
forces of the United States, returns to full-time status within six months
after the eligible student first ceases service to the armed forces and
provides verification to the coordinating board for higher education
that the military service was satisfactorily completed;

(3) Provides verification in compliance with coordinating board for higher
education rules that the service to the nonprofit organization was satisfactorily
completed and was not compensated other than for expenses or that the service
to the state or federal governmental agency or branch of the armed forces of the
United States was satisfactorily completed; and

87 [(3)] (4) Meets all other requirements established for eligibility to receive88 a renewal scholarship.

6. A recipient of academic scholarship awarded under this section may
transfer from one approved Missouri public or private institution to another
without losing eligibility for the scholarship. If a recipient of the scholarship at

92 any time withdraws from an approved private or public institution so that under 93 the rules and regulations of that institution he or she is entitled to a refund of 94 any tuition, fees or other charges, the institution shall pay the portion of the 95 refund attributable to the scholarship for that term to the coordinating board for 96 higher education.

97 7. Other provisions of this section to the contrary notwithstanding, if a 98recipient has been awarded an initial academic scholarship pursuant to the provisions of this section but is unable to use the scholarship during the first 99 academic year because of illness, disability, pregnancy or other medical need or 100if a recipient ceases all attendance at an approved public or private institution 101 102because of illness, disability, pregnancy or other medical need, the recipient shall be eligible for an initial or renewal scholarship upon enrollment in or return to 103104any approved public or private institution, provided the recipient:

(1) Enrolls in or returns to full-time status within twenty-seven months;
(2) Provides verification in compliance with coordinating board for higher
education rules of sufficient medical evidence documenting an illness, disability,
pregnancy or other medical need of such person to require that that person will
not be able to use the initial or renewal scholarship during the time period for
which it was originally offered; and

(3) Meets all other requirements established for eligibility to receive aninitial or a renewal scholarship.

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
