## JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri, an amendment repealing sections 2(a) and 2(b) of article IX of the Constitution of Missouri, and adopting two new sections in lieu thereof relating to the state board of education, with an effective date.

Be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring therein:
That at the next general election to be held in the state of Missouri, on Tuesday next following the first Monday in November, 2010, or at a special election to be called by the governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted to the qualified voters of this state, for adoption or rejection, the following amendment to article IX of the Constitution of the state of Missouri:

Section A. Sections 2(a) and 2(b), article IX, Constitution of Missouri, are repealed and two new sections adopted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 2(a) and 2(b), to read as follows:

Section 2(a). 1. The supervision of instruction in the public schools and coordination of public higher education shall be vested in a state board of education[, consisting of eight lay members]. The board shall promote the development of a seamless and efficient system of education. The board shall consist of six members who shall be appointed by the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate; provided, that at no time shall more
than [four] three members be of the same political party. The term of office of each member shall be [eight] six years, except the terms of the first appointees shall be [from one to eight years, respectively] two years for two members, four years for two members, and six years for two members. While attending to the duties of their office, members shall be entitled to receive only actual expenses incurred, and a per diem fixed by law.
2. The board shall have other powers and duties as prescribed by law.
3. The board shall succeed the state board of education heretofore established as well as the coordinating board for higher education and the department of higher education, with all powers and duties as may be prescribed by law.
4. The provisions of this section shall become effective July 1 , 2011.

Section 2(b). The board shall select and appoint a commissioner of education as its chief administrative officer, who shall be a citizen and resident of the state, and removable at its discretion. The appointment and selection of the commissioner shall require the advice and consent of the senate. The board shall prescribe his or her duties and fix his or her compensation, and upon his or her recommendation shall appoint the professional staff and fix their compensation. The board shall succeed the state board of education heretofore established, with all its powers and duties, and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by law.
