**JOINT RESOLUTION**

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri, an amendment to article I of the Constitution of Missouri relating to the right to hunt and fish.

*Be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring therein:*

That at the next general election to be held in the state of Missouri, on  
2 Tuesday next following the first Monday in November, 2012, or at a special  
3 election to be called by the governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted  
4 to the qualified voters of this state, for adoption or rejection, the following  
5 amendment to article I of the Constitution of the state of Missouri:

Section A. Article I, Constitution of Missouri, is amended by adding  
2 thereto one new section, to be known as section 35, to read as follows:

**Section 35. That the citizens of this state have a right to hunt,  
2 fish, and harvest wildlife. The control, management, restoration,  
3 conservation, and regulation of the bird, fish, game, forestry, and all  
4 wildlife resources of the state, and the administration of all laws  
5 pertaining thereto, is vested in a conservation commission, as provided  
6 in section 40 of article IV of the Missouri Constitution. No law and no  
7 rule or regulation shall unreasonably restrict hunting, fishing, and  
8 harvesting wildlife or the use of traditional devices and  
9 methods. Laws, rules, and regulations authorized under this section  
10 shall have the purpose of wildlife conservation and management and  
11 preserving the future of hunting and fishing. Public hunting and  
12 fishing shall be a preferred means of managing and controlling  
13 wildlife. This section shall not be construed to modify any provision of  
14 common law or statutes relating to trespass or property rights.**
