AN ACT

To amend chapter 173, RSMo, by adding thereto four new sections relating to the early high school graduation scholarship program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 173, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto four new 2 sections, to be known as sections 173.1300, 173.1303, 173.1306, and 173.1309, to 3 read as follows:

173.1300. 1. There is hereby established the "Early High School Graduation Scholarship Program" to provide assistance to eligible students in Missouri that graduate from high school in accordance with the provisions of sections 173.1300 to 173.1309. The department of higher education shall implement and administer the program. Sections 173.1300 to 173.1309 shall be known and may be cited as the "Early High School Graduation Scholarship Program Act".

8 2. As used in sections 173.1300 to 173.1309, the following terms
9 shall mean:

10 (1) "Eligible student", a student who qualifies for a scholarship
11 under sections 173.1300 to 173.1309 and who:

(a) Has received approval from a parent or legal guardian;

(b) Has graduated from a public high school in Missouri in the
time frame specified in section 173.1303 or 173.1306;

(c) Has attended one or more public high schools in Missouri for
more than half of the time the student attended high school; and

17 (d) Is a United States citizen, permanent resident, or otherwise
18 lawfully authorized to be present in the United States;

(2) "Private institution of higher education", a nonprofit
institution, dedicated to educational purposes, located in Missouri
which:

(a) Is operated privately under the control of an independent
board and not directly controlled or administered by any public agency
or political subdivision;

(b) Provides a postsecondary course of instruction at least six
months in length leading to or directly creditable toward a certificate
or degree;

(c) Meets the standards for accreditation as determined by either the Higher Learning Commission or by other accrediting bodies recognized by the United States Department of Education or by utilizing accreditation standards applicable to nondegree-granting institutions as established by the coordinating board for higher education;

(d) Does not discriminate in the hiring of administrators, faculty
and staff or in the admission of students on the basis of race, color,
religion, sex, or national origin and is in compliance with the Federal
Civil Rights Acts of 1964 and 1968 and executive orders issued pursuant
thereto. Sex discrimination as used herein shall not apply to admission
practices of institutions offering the enrollment limited to one sex;

40 (e) Permits faculty members to select textbooks without
41 influence or pressure by any religious or sectarian source;

42 (3) "Public institution of higher education", an educational
43 institution located in Missouri which:

44 (a) Is directly controlled or administered by a public agency or
45 political subdivision;

46 (b) Receives appropriations directly or indirectly from the
47 general assembly for operating expenses;

48 (c) Provides a postsecondary course of instruction at least six
49 months in length leading to or directly creditable toward a degree or
50 certificate;

51 (d) Meets the standards for accreditation as determined by 52 either the Higher Learning Commission, or if a public community 53 college created under the provisions of sections 178.370 to 178.400 54 meets the standards established by the coordinating board for higher 55 education for such public community colleges, or by other accrediting bodies recognized by the United States Department of Education or by
utilizing accreditation standards applicable to the institution as
established by the coordinating board for higher education;

(e) Does not discriminate in the hiring of administrators, faculty
and staff or in the admission of students on the basis of race, color,
religion, sex, or national origin and is otherwise in compliance with the
Federal Civil Rights Acts of 1964 and 1968 and executive orders issued
pursuant thereto;

64 (f) Permits faculty members to select textbooks without influence
65 or pressure by any religious or sectarian source.

3. An eligible student who receives a scholarship under sections 66 173.1300 to 173.1309 shall use the scholarship within one year of 67 graduating from high school except as provided within this subsection 68 or subsection 4 of this section. If he or she is unable to enroll during 69 the first academic year following high school graduation for the 70purpose of providing service to a nonprofit organization, a state or 71federal government agency, or any branch of the armed forces of the 7273United States, he or she shall be offered a scholarship upon enrollment 74in any public or private institution of higher education after the 75completion of his or her service, if all other requirements and the 76following criteria are met:

77 (1) For an eligible student who cannot attend a public or private 78institution of higher education as a result of service to a non-profit 79 organization or a state or federal government agency, he or she returns 80 to full-time status within twenty-seven months and provides verification to the department of higher education that the service to 81 82the nonprofit organization was satisfactorily completed and was not compensated other than for expenses, or that the service to the state or 83 federal government agency was satisfactorily completed; or 84

(2) For an eligible student who cannot attend a public or private institution of higher education as a result of military service in any branch of the armed forces of the United States, he or she returns to full-time status within six months after he or she first ceases service to the armed forces and provides verification to the department of higher education that the military service was satisfactorily completed.

91 4. An eligible student may seek an extension from the
92 requirements of subsection 3 of this section if he or she is able to show

93 hardship or other good cause that prevents him or her from enrolling 94 in a public or private institution of higher education within one year 95 of graduating from high school. Hardship or other good cause shall 96 include a severe illness or other debilitating condition or responsibility 97 for the care of a sick, injured, or needy person. The department of 98 higher education shall determine whether a student qualifies for an 99 extension under this subsection.

173.1303. 1. An eligible student who receives a scholarship under this section may use the scholarship money at a public or private institution of higher education for tuition, mandatory fees, or both. An eligible student who has participated in a dual credit or dual enrollment program with his or her high school and an institution of higher education may use the scholarship money to pay any fees necessary to receive official post-secondary credit for work completed through such program.

9 2. If an eligible student completes high school graduation requirements and receives a high school diploma in not more than 10 11 thirty-six months, he or she shall be offered a scholarship in the amount determined in subsection 4 of this section. For each eligible 1213student, an amount equal to ninety percent of the school district's state 14aid payments pursuant to the provisions of sections 163.031, 163.043, and 163.044 for the year immediately preceding the eligible student's 1516receipt of the high school diploma, divided by the district's average daily attendance for the year immediately preceding the student's 17 receipt of the high school diploma shall be placed in the fund 18established in this section. The school district from which the eligible 1920student graduated shall be offered a grant in an amount equal to ten percent of the school district's state aid payments pursuant to the 21provisions of sections 163.031, 163.043, and 163.044 for the year 22immediately preceding the eligible student's receipt of the high school 23diploma, divided by the district's average daily attendance for the year 24immediately preceding the student's receipt of the high school diploma 25when the student is offered, and accepts, the scholarship. 26

Upon enrollment of an eligible student in a public or private
 institution of higher education, the institution shall apply to his or her
 charges for tuition or mandatory fees, as applicable, for the enrollment
 period an amount equal to the lesser of the:

31 (1) Amount of the scholarship as calculated under this section;
 32 or

(2) Student's actual tuition or mandatory fees.

4. The department of higher education shall use the moneys in the fund created in this section to distribute scholarships to students and grants to high schools under this section. The department of higher education shall distribute the grant moneys to eligible high schools. After such distribution, the scholarship amount awarded to an eligible student shall be determined by dividing the remaining amount of money in the fund by the number of eligible students.

5. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Early High 41School Graduation Scholarship Program Fund I", which shall consist of 42money collected under this section. The state treasurer shall be 43custodian of the fund and may approve disbursements from the fund in 44 accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180. Upon appropriation, money 45in the fund shall be used solely for the administration of this 46section. Any moneys remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium 47 48shall revert to the credit of the general revenue fund. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other 4950funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such 51investments shall be credited to the fund.

173.1306. 1. If an eligible student completes high school $\mathbf{2}$ graduation requirements and receives a high school diploma in not more than forty-one months, he or she shall be offered a scholarship in 3 the amount determined under subsection 4 of this section. For each 4 eligible student, an amount equal to ninety percent of the school 56 district's state aid payments pursuant to the provisions of sections 7163.031, 163.043, and 163.044 for the semester immediately preceding the eligible student's receipt of the high school diploma, divided by the 8 district's average daily attendance for the semester immediately 9 preceding the student's receipt of the high school diploma shall be 10 placed in the fund established in this section as provided in subsection 11 4 of this section. The school district from which the student graduated 1213shall be offered a grant in an amount equal to ten percent of the school district's state aid payments pursuant to the provisions of sections 14 163.031, 163.043, and 163.044 for the semester immediately preceding 15the student's receipt of the high school diploma, divided by the 16

17 district's average daily attendance for the semester immediately
18 preceding the student's receipt of the high school diploma when the
19 student is offered, and accepts, the scholarship.

20 2. An eligible student who receives a scholarship under this 21 section shall use the scholarship money to participate in a dual 22 enrollment program with his or her high school and an institution of 23 higher education or shall use the scholarship money to pay any fees 24 necessary to receive official post-secondary credit for work completed 25 through such program.

3. The department of higher education shall use the moneys in the fund created in this section to distribute scholarships to students and grants to high schools under this section. The department of higher education shall distribute the grant moneys to eligible high schools. After such distribution, the scholarship amount awarded to an eligible student shall be determined by dividing the remaining amount of money in the fund by the number of eligible students.

4. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Early High 33 34School Graduation Scholarship Program Fund II", which shall consist 35of money collected under this section. The state treasurer shall be 36 custodian of the fund and may approve disbursements from the fund in 37accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180. Upon appropriation, money in the fund shall be used solely for the administration of this 3839section. Any moneys remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium shall revert to the credit of the general revenue fund. The state 40treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other 41funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such 4243investments shall be credited to the fund.

173.1309. 1. The department of higher education shall annually2 prepare a report that includes the following information:

3 (1) The name of each student who qualifies for a scholarship 4 under sections 173.1300 to 173.1309;

5 (2) The length of time taken for each student who qualifies for 6 the scholarship to graduate from high school; and

7 (3) The school district from which each student graduated from8 high school.

9 The department of higher education shall submit the report to the 10 commissioner of education by June thirtieth.

2. The department of elementary and secondary education shall confirm with the high school from which the eligible student graduated that he or she has completed all of the eligibility requirements of the program. The department shall also, with the cooperation of the department of higher education, confirm that he or she has enrolled in, and is attending, a public or private institution of higher education or participating in a dual enrollment program, as applicable.

3. Each public high school in Missouri shall provide information
about the early high school graduation scholarship program and its
requirements to the following individuals:

(1) Each student enrolled in the school at the beginning of his or
her first year of high school;

(2) Each student who enrolls in the school before the student's
senior year who did not receive the information under subdivision (1)
of this subsection; and

26 (3) A parent, conservator, or legal guardian of the student under
27 subdivisions (1) and (2) of this subsection.

4. The information provided under subsection 3 of this section shall include the following:

30 (1) The number and type of high school course credits necessary
31 to satisfy the eligibility requirements for the early high school
32 graduation scholarship program; and

33 (2) The appropriate order in which those high school course
 34 credits shall be earned to satisfy eligibility requirements.

355. By January 31, 2012, the department of higher education, in cooperation with the department of elementary and secondary 36 37education, shall prepare a publication that includes the information required to be provided under this section. The department of higher 38education shall post that publication on its website in a form that 39 enables a public high school to reproduce the information for 40distribution to students, parents, and other persons as required by this 41 42section.

6. The department of higher education shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary to implement sections 173.1300 to 173.1309. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010 that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, and, if applicable, section
536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of
the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536,
to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule
are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking
authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2011, shall
be invalid and void.
