AN ACT

To repeal section 407.1355, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to social security numbers.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 407.1355, RSMo, is repealed and one new section

- 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 407.1355, to read as follows:
- 407.1355. 1. Except as provided in this section a person or entity, not 2 including a state or local agency, shall not do any of the following:
- 3 (1) Publicly post or publicly display in any manner, in whole or in part,
- 4 an individual's Social Security number. "Publicly post" or "publicly display" is
- 5 defined in this section to intentionally communicate or otherwise make available
- 6 to the general public or to an individual's co-workers;
- 7 (2) Require an individual to transmit, in whole or in part, his or her
- 8 Social Security number over the Internet, unless the connection is secure or the
- 9 Social Security number is encrypted;
- 10 (3) Require an individual to use his or her Social Security number, in
- 11 whole or in part, to access an Internet website, unless a password, unique
- 12 personal identification number, or other authentication device is also required to
- 13 access the Internet website;
- 14 (4) Require an individual to use his or her Social Security number, in
- 15 whole or in part, as an employee number for any type of employment-related
- 16 activity.
- 17 2. The provisions of subsection 1 of this section apply only to the use of
- 18 Social Security numbers on or after January 1, 2006.
- 19 3. This section does not prevent the collection, use, or release of a Social
- 20 Security number as required by state or federal law or the use of a Social Security

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- 21 number for internal verification or administrative purposes.
- 4. This section does not apply to documents that are recorded or required to be open to the public pursuant to chapter 610. This section does not apply to
- 25 available to the public.

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5. If a federal law takes effect requiring the United States Department of

records that are required by statute, case law, or Missouri court rules to be made

- 27 Health and Human Services to establish a national unique patient health
- 28 identifier program, any person or entity that complies with the federal law shall
- 29 be deemed in compliance with this section.

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
